

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, pursuant to Section 130 of the Town Law of the State of New York, and resolution of the Town Board of the Town of Orangetown, adopted January 14, 2014, a public hearing will be held by the Town Board, at the Orangetown Town Hall, 26 Orangeburg Road, Orangeburg, New York 10962, on the 28th day of January, 2014, at 8:00 P.M., to consider a proposed Local Law that repeals the existing Chapter 14B of the Town Code and adopts a new Chapter 14B, both entitled "Flood Damage Prevention".

The proposed Local Law includes Base Floodplain Elevations and Advisory Base Floodplain Elevations, as established on a Flood Insurance Rate Map, to be effective March 3, 2014, and otherwise meets the standards of the National Flood Insurance Program. The Law further authorizes the Town Zoning Board of Appeals to act as the body authorized to hear appeals and to grant variances and other relief from the requirements of the Local Law, as provided therein.

A copy of the proposed Local Law may be examined by any interested party at the Office of the Town Clerk.

All interested persons will be given an opportunity to be heard.


