

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, pursuant to Town Board Resolution 670 of 2011, and Town Board Resolution 32 of 2012, duly adopted on January 24, 2012, a public hearing will be continued by the Town Board of the Town of Orangetown at Orangetown Town Hall, 26 Orangeburg Road, Orangeburg, New York, on the 16th day of February, 2012, at 8:00 PM to consider the application of FB Orangetown, LLC to amend a Special Permit previously issued by the Town Board, pursuant to Article 43, Section 4.32(O) of the Town Zoning Law permitting the mixed-use development of property located at 170 Route 303, Orangeburg, NY (the intersection of State Rte. 303 and the Palisades Interstate Parkway at Interchange 5 and State Rte. 303 and Stevens Way) (Tax Map designation 74.15-1-21).

The proposed amendment would affect the retail component of the approved project combining two retail areas into a single full service Stop & shop Foodmarket, with the related reconfiguration of portions of the internal access roads and a relocation of a proposed bank, and would increase the square footage and number of rooms of one of the two hotels in the approved project by 1,450 s.f. and 4 rooms. The Application Submission Booklet, which includes a Full Environmental Assessment Form, and the Amended Concept Plan (last revised December 22, 2011) are on file and available for review in the Town Clerk's Office during regular business hours.



Orangeburg, L.L.C. to amend a Special Permit previously issued by the Town Board, pursuant to Article 4-A, Section 4-320(O) of the Town Zoning Law permitting the mixed-use development of property located at 1170 Route 303, Orangeburg, NY (the intersection of State Rte. 303 and the Palisades Interstate Parkway at Interchanges 4 and State Rte. 303 and Stevens Way) (See map designation "Map 1-2").

The proposed amendment would affect the existing component of the approved project combining two alterations into a single full service Stop & Shop Foodmarket, with the revised reconfiguration of portions of the external access tracks and a relocation of a proposed bank, and would increase the usage forgive and number of rooms of one of the two hotels in the approved project by 1,450 sf. and 4 rooms. 

The audit for tonight has four warrants than total to \$12,184,059.69.

The first warrant is \$10,528,360 for property tax collections for special districts including fire and ambulance districts, the Rockland Paramedics and the four South Orangetown hamlet libraries.

The second warrant for \$271,123 is primarily for utility costs including \$97,271 for United Water and \$85,165 for Orange and Rockland. Direct Energy cost electricity) are \$37,117 while Intelligent Energy bills for natural gas are \$18,407.

The third warrant was a \$15 witness fee for Nick Di Marco.

The fourth warrant is \$1,364,562 for 351 unpaid invoices. These include:

1. Adler Consulting (p1) - \$5,963 for a traffic study for Orangeburg Commons. This cost will be reimbursed by the developer.
2. Atlantic Salt (pp7-8) - \$90,958 for roughly 2,000 tons of salt for the Highway Department. And other departments.
3. Bauer-Crowley (p8) - \$10,100 for boiler and machinery insurance.
4. Beckerle Lumber Supply (pp 9-13) - \$8,050 for supplies for the Highway department and other departments.
5. Berry Burners (p14) - \$12,575 for a service contract for air conditioning at various Town buildings.
6. Charles Capasso (p19) - \$48,565 for January recycling costs.
7. Chase Equipment Financing (p19) - \$53,828 for the first quarterly 2012 payment on the energy performance contract.
8. CSEA Employment Benefit Fund (p 22-23) - \$26,045 for February dental and vision benefits for non-police.

9. Fanshawe Inc. (p27) - \$10,555 for retainage on the Blue Hill Club House renovations.
10. Financial Risk Analysts (p30) - \$6,900 for actuarial services for the 2011 audit.
11. Frontline Communications (p33) - \$8,500 for fiber line cost for February.
12. Steven Gentile (p34) - \$8,573 for 207c payment for two pay periods.
13. Highway Traffic Supply (p38) - \$5,167 for road sign and traffic paint for the Highway Department.
14. HP Direct (p39) - \$5,304 for computer equipment for the Police Department.
15. Metropolitan Life (pp 51-52) - \$12,186 for February dental costs for the Police.
16. NY Bituminous (pp 53 - 56) - \$102,280 for highway repair materials.
17. NYS Department of Civil Service (p57-58) - \$550,544 for February health insurance.
18. O'Connor Davies Munns & Dobbins (p59) - \$74,175 for partial payment (75%) on the 2011 audit.
19. Orange and Rockland Utilities (p59) - \$15,504 for transmission charges.
20. Pearl River Plumbing, Heating & Electric (p62) - \$20,124 for the Blue Hill Club House (final payment).
21. Reserve Account (p68) - \$11,000 to replenish postage on the Piney Bowes machine.
22. Rockland County Solid Waste Management (p70) - \$6,057 for tipping fees for January at the County's transfer station.
23. Keneck Skibinski (p.73) - \$8,386 for operator services for DEME. (Please note we will need to raise the contract amount to pay this bill. We will be \$4,000 over the existing Town Board resolution.)
24. SOS Fuels (pp74-75) - \$7,531 for heating oil for the golf courses, museum, and parks.
25. Sprague Energy (pp 75-77) - \$43,037 for vehicle fuel for town departments.
26. Staples (pp 77- 81) - \$5,223 for 19 office supply invoices.
27. Tilcon (p84) - \$8,927 for liquid asphalt for the Highway Department.
28. Victor Zugibe Inc. (p89) - \$8,500 for two spur repairs.

29. W. Harris & Sons (pp89 - 90) - \$41,143 for four sewer repairs including \$28,900 for the replacement of 80 feet of pipe in Blarneyt.
