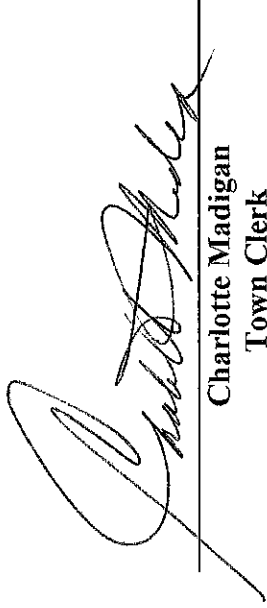

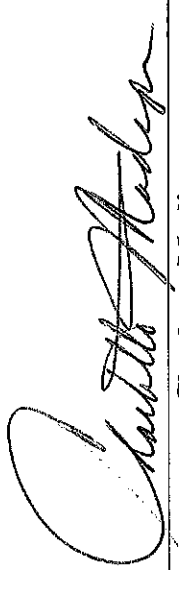

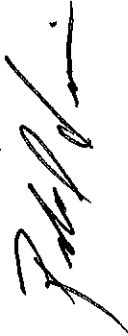

LAND ACQUISITION AND FINANCING CHERRY BROOK DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT No. 1

STATE ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY REVIEW (SEQR) NEGATIVE DECLARATION NOTICE OF DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE

This Notice is issued pursuant to Part 617 of the implementing regulations of Article 8 (SEQRA) of the Environmental Conservation Law.

The Lead Agency has determined that the proposed action described below will not have a significant effect on the environment.

TITLE OF ACTION:

Land Acquisition for Cherry Brook Drainage Improvements, Project 1, and Related Financing.

SEQRA STATUS:

Unlisted Action

DESCRIPTION OF ACTION:

The proposed action consists of the acquisition, and the financing thereof, of approximately 4.7 ± acres of vacant land on which the Town of Orangetown shall install drainage improvements, consisting of a storm water detention basin and ancillary structures and equipment, to mitigate drainage conditions along and involving the Cherry Brook.

DETERMINATION :

There will be no significant adverse environmental impact(s) as a result of the proposed action.

REASONS SUPPORTING THIS DETERMINATION:

The present action consists is limited to the acquisition, and financing of the acquisition of approximately 4.7 ± acres of vacant land on which the Town of Orangetown intends to install drainage improvements, consisting of a storm water detention basin and ancillary structures and equipment, to mitigate drainage conditions along and involving the Cherry Brook.

By way of background, in late 2004 through July 2005, the Town of Orangetown conducted a study of the flooding problems on the Cherry Brook, a mostly culverted stream that rises within the Town boundaries, and flows across the Town/New Jersey border south of Gilbert Avenue in the hamlet of Pearl River, also within the Town boundaries. Flooding has been prevalent on this Brook for many years, particularly near the northern, upstream end, and just north of Gilbert Avenue, near the southern, downstream end.

The study, contracted to the firm of HDR, examined the physical characteristics of the drainage basin, the flooding effects of rainfall events of varying severities on the basin, alternative methods of ameliorating the effects, and the costs of these alternatives. The findings of the study were reported in the HDR report of July 2005, and the course of action chosen by the Town was developed in consultation with the Wyeth Corporation, the owner of property within the Cherry Brook drainage basin on which a detention system will be constructed to lessen the effects of the storm water runoff.

The study examined the beneficial effects and approximate costs of several alternatives for the lessening of the effects of storm water runoff in the Cherry Brook basin: detention on the Wyeth main Campus; storage at the Crooked Hill Road site, also owned by Wyeth and the location of the currently proposed Phase 1 project; increased conveyance capacity south of the Crooked Hill Road area; storage in the middle portions of the Brook, at Franklin Avenue and the Franklin Avenue School; and, combinations of the above.

The conclusion was that the most cost effective approach to solving the flooding problems in the upper portion of the drainage basin would be to provide storage of the runoff at the indicated location, and subsequent release after the end of the rainfall to the existing storm sewer system. A total storage capacity of 25 acre-feet, if established north (upstream) of East Carroll Street, would be expected to fully protect the area from flooding in, approximately, the once in 100 year, 24 hour storm; the originally proposed means of providing this storage was in two separate detention basins, a 5 acre-foot deepening of an existing depression on the Wyeth Main Campus, and a 20 acre-foot detention basin just south of Crooked Hill Road, also on property owned by Wyeth, but that proposal was rejected by Wyeth.

After continued consultation on the Draft Study findings with Wyeth, it was decided to provide the entire 25 acre-feet of storage at the Crooked Hill Road site; this would be accomplished by making the basin deeper than the invert of the existing storm sewer at the

outlet end of the basin, and pumping the water that would not flow out by gravity. This Project has been designated Project 1 by the Town.

This project is the first of a series of contemplated flood amelioration and drainage improvements in the Cherry Brook watershed. Future work, consisting of upgrading and expanding drainage systems, are proposed downstream of the detention basin. The detention basin nor the future improvements are not functionally or materially dependent upon each other, but will serve the overall goal of reducing documented flooding problems. The detention basin is being evaluated separately in order to affect a public benefit in 2005. The future improvements will also be evaluated under SEQR.

On September 12, 2005, the Town Board, acting in its capacity as Lead Agency under SEQR, considered a Full EAF (Parts 1 and 2) completed and filed in connection with the Board's consideration of the physical components of the project, i.e., the physical alteration of the lands with the referenced improvements, and, based thereon, issued a Negative Declaration. The reasoning, findings and conclusions set forth in that Negative Declaration are hereby reaffirmed and expressly incorporated herein by reference.

CONCLUSION

The proposed action is limited to the acquisition and financing of the lands on which the upstream Cherry Brook drainage improvements, previously approved, will be constructed.

As noted above, a Full EAF (Parts 1 and 2) was completed and filed in connection with the Town Board's consideration of the physical components of the project, identifying the impacts, if any, associated with, or relating to, those physical improvements to the land now being acquired, and, based thereon, a determination of non-significance was issued.

The expense to the Town associated with the acquisition of the lands needed for the larger project, to be financed through the issuance of serial bonds over a period of five (5) years, in the Town Board's judgment, in consultation with the Town's Director of Finance, will not have a significant adverse effect on the Town's finances, and, therefore, will not have a significant adverse environmental impact.

Given the above, after evaluating all of the potential environmental impacts relating to the proposed action, the Town Board concludes that there will be no significant environmental effect caused either by acquisition and financing of the lands required for the construction of the detention basin and ancillary structures and equipment at the Crooked Hill Road site, known as Cherry Brook Drainage Improvements Project 1, or by the actual construction of those improvements.

Councilman Troy offered the following resolution and moved its

adoption:

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF ORANGETOWN, NEW YORK,
ADOPTED OCTOBER 24, 2005, AUTHORIZING ACQUISITION OF A
PARCEL OF REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 110 E. CROOKED HILL
ROAD, IN SAID TOWN, FOR USE BY THE TOWN, STATING THE
ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$750,000, APPROPRIATING
SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF
\$750,000 BONDS OF SAID TOWN TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION.

THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF ORANGETOWN, IN THE COUNTY
OF ROCKLAND, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable vote of not less than
two-thirds of all the members of said Town Board) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town of Orangetown, in the County of Rockland, New York
(herein called the "Town"), is hereby authorized to acquire an approximately 4.7 acre parcel of
real property located at 110 E. Crooked Hill Road, in the hamlet of Pearl River, (being Tax Map
No. section 68.12, block 3, lot 21), in said Town, for use by the Town for drainage purposes. The
estimated maximum cost thereof, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to
the financing thereof, is \$750,000 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of
financing includes the issuance of \$750,000 bonds of the Town to finance said appropriation, and
the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the Town to pay the principal of
said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Bonds of the Town in the principal amount of \$750,000 are hereby
authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter
33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (referred to herein as the "Law"), to
finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

(a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the object or purpose for which said bonds are authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 21 of the Law, is thirty (30) years; however, the bonds authorized pursuant to this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall mature no later than five (5) years from the date of original issuance of said bonds or notes.

(b) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the Town for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized, or for expenditures made before such effective date if the Town had made a prior declaration of intent to issue indebtedness therefor. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

(c) The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by this resolution will not exceed five years.

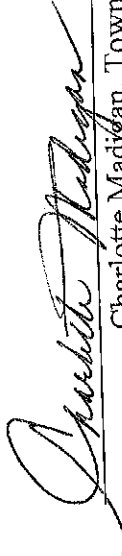

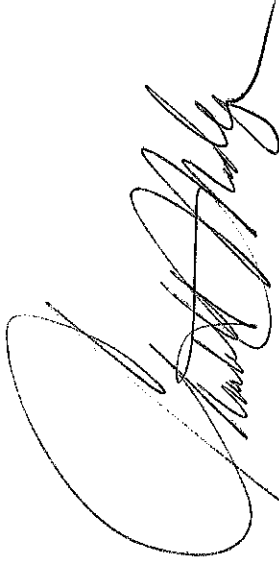

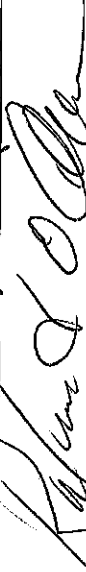

THE ORANGETOWN SEWER DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Orangetown (herein called "Town Board" and "Town", respectively), in the County of Rockland, New York, has heretofore caused the Director of Environmental Management and Engineering, a competent engineer duly licensed by the State of New York, to prepare a general map, plan and report for the proposed establishment of The Orangetown Sewer District (herein called "District"), in the Town,

consisting of the acquisition of sanitary sewer systems of the villages of Grandview-on-Hudson, Nyack, Piermont and South Nyack (collectively, the "Villages"), in the Town, the transfer and/or reallocation of real and personal property of the Town of Orangetown's Sewer Collection and Treatment System to the District, and the reconstruction and/or replacement of existing screening and grit removal systems, reconstruction of the administration/control/laboratory buildings, the installation of new drive mechanisms for primary and secondary clarifiers, conversion of gaseous chlorination systems to a liquid hypochlorite system and/or ultraviolet disinfection systems, reconstruction and/or replacement of odor control systems, improvements to the heating, ventilation, air conditioning and piping systems, roof and structural reconstruction, improvements to the security and drainage systems, landscape improvements; the installation and/or reconstruction of new pumps, motors, controls, emergency generators, telemetry systems at the Better Brands, Hunt Road, Pearl Street, Nyack and Upper Nyack pumping stations and the wastewater treatment plant, and the replacement and /or paralleling of the Better Brands force main, the Hunt Road force main, the Hunt Road siphon, the Pearl Street force main and the Pearl Street influent sewer, at the estimated maximum cost of \$22,100,000; (collectively, the "Improvements"); which map, plan and report has been duly filed in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town for public inspection, and

a deed of conveyance, the fact that the facilities to be acquired at no cost to the Town or the District, the method of financing to be employed, the fact that a map, plan and report describing the same are on file in the Town Clerk's office for public inspection and specifying August 8, 2005, at 8:00 o'clock P.M. (Prevailing Time) and as continued on September 12, 2005 as the time when, and the Town Hall, in the Town, as the place where, the Town Board would meet to consider the proposed establishment of the District, the acquisition of such sewer system to be reconstructed therein, the transfer and/or reallocation of real and personal property of the Town of Orangetown's Sewer Collection and Treatment System to the District and the construction of the Improvements, and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same, and for such other action on the part of the Town Board in relation thereto, as may be required by Law; and

WHEREAS, certified copies of such Order were duly published and posted pursuant to the provisions of Articles 12 and 12-A of the Town Law; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has given due consideration to the impact that the establishment of the District, the acquisition of such sewer systems, the transfer and/or reallocation of real and personal property of the Town of Orangetown's Sewer Collection and Treatment System to the District and the construction of the Improvements may have on the environment and on the basis of such consideration, the Town Board has found that no substantial adverse environmental impact will be caused by the establishment of such District; and

(Prevailing Time), at said Town Hall, at which all interested persons desiring to be heard were heard, including those in favor of, and those opposed to, the proposed establishment of the District and the acquisition of the sewer system to be reconstructed therein, the transfer and/or reallocation of real and personal property of the Town of Orangetown's Sewer Collection and Treatment System to the District and the construction of the Improvements;

WHEREAS, following publication and posting of certified copies of said Order pursuant to Article 12-A of the Town Law and after a public hearing duly held by the Town Board at the time and place herein referred to, the Town Board, by resolution duly adopted September 12, 2005, determined that the notice of public hearing was published and posted as required by law and were otherwise sufficient, that all the property and property owners included within the proposed District are benefitted thereby, that all the property and property owners benefitted were included within the limits of the proposed District, that it was in the public interest to establish the District and approved the District and the construction of the Improvements, as hereinabove described; and that the proposed improvements shall be financed by the issuance of \$22,100,000 serial bonds of the Town and the levy and collection of assessments from the several lots and parcels of land within the District which the Town Board shall determine and specify to be especially benefitted thereby, so much upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of benefit conferred upon the same, a portion of such benefit to be determined and ascertained by virtue of the assessed value of all real property

within the District, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable; and

WHEREAS, said resolution adopted September 12, 2005 was subject to permissive referendum and the notice setting forth the date of adoption of said resolution, which concisely stated the purpose and effect thereof, was duly posted and published as required by law; and

WHEREAS, no petition has been filed within thirty (30) days of adoption of said resolution after publishing and posting an abstract thereof in accord with the Town Law

Now, therefore, be it

ORDERED, that the District is hereby approved, in the Town of Orangetown, to be known as The Orangetown Sewer District, in the Town of Orangetown, and bounded and described as follows:
