WHEREAS, the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the Proposed Improvements, including contingencies, administrative and legal expenses and costs of financing, as described in the Report, was originally proposed to be \$162,500, which is planned to be financed by the issuance of serial bonds of the Town, and the assessment, levy and collection of assessments upon the several lots and parcels of land in the Proposed Benefitted Area in the same manner and at the same time as other Town charges;

WHEREAS, due to the inclusion of associated engineering and design fees and to the passage of time, the costs of materials to be used in the construction of the Proposed Improvements have substantially increased and

WHEREAS, by a letter dated November 2, 2004, Lawler, Matusky & Skelly, Engineers, LLP, duly licensed engineers by the State of New York, has determined that the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the Proposed Improvements, including contingencies, administrative and legal expenses and costs of financing, be increased by \$112,500, so that the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the Proposed Improvements is now \$275,000, which is planned to be financed by the issuance of serial bonds of the Town, and the assessment, levy and collection of assessments upon the several lots and parcels of land in the Proposed Benefitted Area in the same manner and at the same time as other Town charges, now therefore, be it

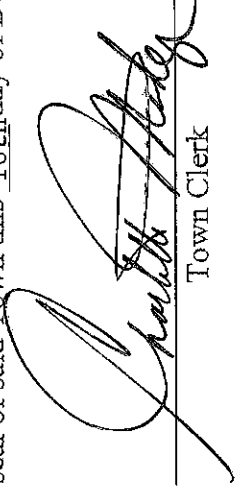

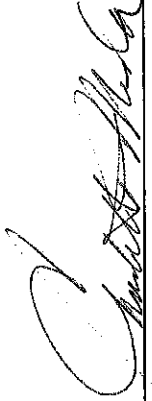
