She also requested a moratorium on mega warehouses until the new Comprehensive Plan is completed.

Eileen Larkin, Palisades, wants to know if the new Comprehensive Plan will include the villages; and community input. She believes a better spot for the commuter lot is on Oak Tree Road next to Sullivan’s.

Jackie Dreschler, Valley Cottage, preserving the character of Orangetown is important and the new Comprehensive Plan should reflect that. A way to preserve Orangetown’s character is to stop overdevelopment.

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Brenner's draft of a proposed interlocal agreement and the Town Attorney's draft of a proposed letter of intent have been circulated to the Highway Department, the Department of Environmental Management and Engineering, the Police Department, and the Building Department; and

**WHEREAS**, said departments have no objection to the Town entering into a reasonable interlocal agreement with the Borough of Montvale in this regard or with the Town Board authorizing signature of the proposed letter of intent.
