AN ACT in relation to authorizing the town of Orangetown, county of Rockland to discontinue the use of certain park land

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Subject to the provisions of this act, the town of Orange-
- 2 town, Rockland County, acting by and through its governing body, and
- 3 upon such terms and conditions as determined by such body, is hereby
- 4 authorized to: (a) discontinue the use as park land and alienate the
- 5 lands described in section three of this act, and convey such lands by
- 6 appropriate instrument to the county of Rockland, for the purpose of the
- 7 county of Rockland completing roadway safety improvements, including the

- 8 replacement of a structurally deficient bridge and channel realignment
- 9 in order to reduce flooding in the area; and (b) temporarily discontinue
- 10 the use of the parklands identified in section four of this act, for
- 11 such construction.
- 12 § 2. The authorization provided in section one of this act shall be
- 13 effective only upon the condition that the town of Orangetown dedicate
- 14 an amount of land equal to or greater than the fair market value of
- 15 parklands being discontinued towards the acquisition of new parklands
- 16 and/or capital improvements to existing park and recreational facili-
- 17 ties.
- 18 § 3. The parklands to be permanently alienated by the town of Orange-
- 19 town, Rockland County, pursuant to section one of this act are described
- 20 as follows:

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-

BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary,

the town of Orangetown, a participating employer in the New York state

and local police and fire retirement system, which previously elected to

offer the optional retirement plan established pursuant to section 384-d

of the retirement and social security law to police officers employed by

such police department, is hereby authorized to make participation in

such plan available to police officer Patrick J. Casey who, on the

effective date of this act is covered under the provisions of section

384 of the retirement and social security law, and to police officers

Elizabeth M. Muckell and Keith E. Trojan who, on the effective date of

this act are covered under the provisions of section 375-i of the

retirement and social security law and who, for reasons not ascribable

to their own negligence failed to make a timely application to partic-

ipate in such optional retirement plan. Thereafter, police officers

Patrick J. Casey, Elizabeth M. Muckell and Keith E. Trojan may elect to

be covered by the provisions of section 384-d of the retirement and

social security law, and shall be entitled to the full rights and bene-

fits associated with coverage under such section, by filing a request to

that effect with the state comptroller within one year of the effective

date of this act.

 \S 2. All past service costs associated with implementing the

provisions of this act shall be borne by the town of Orangetown.

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

If this bill is enacted during the 2021 legislative session and Offi-

cers Casey, Muckell, and Trojan become covered under the provisions of

Section 384-d together with 384-e, we anticipate that there will be an

increase of approximately \$41,000 in the annual contributions of the

Town of Orangetown for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2022. In future

years, this cost will vary as the billing rates and salaries of Officers

Casey, Muckell, and Trojan change.

In addition to the annual contributions discussed above, there will be

an immediate past service cost of approximately \$124,000 which will be

borne by the Town of Orangetown as a one-time payment. This estimate is

based on the assumption that payment will be made on February 1, 2022.
