4. AUTHORIZATION FOR OUTDOOR DINING / SIDEWALK CAFES / ECONOMIC RECOVERY / COVID-19

WHEREAS, on June 2, 2020 pursuant to Town Board Resolution 2020-249, the Town Board, in response to the economic recovery as a result of the COVID-19 crisis and pursuant to the authority prescribed in Chapter 6-5(F) of the Orangetown Code, authorized the Director of OBZPAE to waive, modify, and adjust certain requirements of Chapter 31B regarding Sidewalk Cafes and Vending, and to suspend enforcement of the zoning regulations and requirements or land use restrictions to obtain an Outdoor Dining Permit, and to maintain required off-street parking for outdoor dining, at a lawful restaurant and food service establishment, and to issue a Temporary Outdoor Dining Permit and

WHEREAS, one of the conditions of Resolution 2020-249 was that Temporary Outdoor Dining Permits would expire on December 31, 2020 or seven days after the State of New York authorizes restaurants to operate at 100% occupancy, whichever is sooner, and

WHEREAS, on December 15, 2020 pursuant to Town Board Resolution 2020-539, the Town Board extended the temporary suspension of Section 31B of the Town Code and authorized the Director of OBZPAE to issue Temporary Outdoor Dining permits through and including December 31, 2021, subject to the same terms and conditions of Town Board Resolution 2020-249, and

WHEREAS, while a State of Emergency remains in effect in the State of New York related to the COVID-19 crisis, the Governor has recently permitted restaurants to open to full capacity with certain restrictions remaining in place, including social distancing of patrons who are not vaccinated, and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 crisis and the economic recovery therefrom continues to impact the residents and businesses of the Town of Orangetown and the authorization for outdoor dining and sidewalk cafes have provided relief to the businesses in the Town of Orangetown while providing patrons an opportunity to socialize in a safe setting in accordance with the Governor's guidelines for operations of dining facilities during the COVID-19 crisis,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby extends the temporary suspension of Section 31B as set forth in Town Board Resolution 2020-249 and 2020-539 and authorization to the Director of OBZPAE to issue Temporary Outdoor Dining Permits through and including December 31, 2021, subject to all of the terms and conditions as set forth in Resolution 2020-249 and 202- 539, regardless of when the State of New York authorizes restaurants to operate at 100% capacity, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that notwithstanding the foregoing, the combined occupancy of the indoor and outdoor dining for businesses operating under the Temporary Dining Permit, shall not exceed the occupancy limits for the premises related to life safety issues such as fire safety matters and sanitary facilities.

- 5. APPROVE CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION SERVICES / INNOVATIVE PLASTICS CULVERT / COLLIERS ENGINEERING & DESIGN, CT, P.C. (FORMERLY MASER CONSULTING, P.A.)**

RESOLVED, the Town Board hereby approves the retention of COLLIERS ENGINEERING & DESIGN, CT, P.C. (formerly Maser Consulting, PA) to provide Construction & Post- Construction Phase Inspection Services of NYS Route 303 Culvert Project to Mitigate Sediment Transport & Water Quality Impairment to the Sparkill Creek, at a cost of \$78,012.50, pursuant to a written proposal, dated November 5, 2020, incorporated herein by reference and to be filed in the Town Clerk's Office.

RESOLVED, upon the recommendation from the Superintendent of Highways, that the Town Board hereby authorizes the Highway Department upon completion of all necessary paperwork to lend assistance which includes the use of barricades, cones and caution tape for the ACS Relay for Life to be held on Saturday, June 12, 2021 from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, upon the completion of all necessary paperwork, the Superintendent of Parks & Recreation has forwarded for approval by the Town Board the rental of 4 Portable Toilets (3 regular units, 1 ADA accessible) for the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life, Saturday, June 12, 2021.

9. APPROVE FLEXIBLE WORK SCHEDULE / BUILDING MAINTENANCE MECHANIC / JUNE 14 - OCTOBER 15, 2021

RESOLVED, that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, the Town Board hereby approves a change to the basic work week for the Building Maintenance Mechanic from Monday to Friday from 6:30 am to 3 pm, to a four day work week (Monday to Thursday), 6:30 am to 4:30 pm. This flexible work schedule shall be in place from Monday June 14, 2021 though Friday, October 15, 2021. In accordance with Section 5.1.2 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement, the Town Board has the sole responsibility for establishing flexible work hour schedules.

RESOLVED, that upon completion of all necessary paperwork and upon the recommendation from the Superintendent of Highways & the Chief of Police, that the Town Board hereby authorizes these departments to lend assistance which includes the use of barricades, cones, detour signs and no parking signs from the Highway Department and Police detail from OPD, for the Reverend Sanders Road Dedication and Memorial Service, to be held on Sunday, June 13, 2021 from 3pm- 5pm.
