3. SET PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED CHANGE TO TOWN CODE, ADDING A NEW CHAPTER 26 ENTITLED "PUBLIC MEETINGS" / JUNE 13, 2023

RESOLVED that the Town Board will hold a public hearing on June 13, 2023 at 7:05 p.m., on a proposed Local Law, by adding a new chapter to the Town Code, Chapter 26, to be titled "Public Meetings" to permit certain public bodies of Town government to conduct public meetings via videoconferencing under extraordinary circumstances.

4. DECLARATION OF INTENTION OF TOWN BOARD TO SERVE AS LEAD AGENCY PURSUANT TO SEQRA

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 7 of the New York Public Officers law, attendance at public meetings by members of public bodies may be permitted via videoconferencing under extraordinary circumstances, upon adoption of a local law or resolution authorizing same and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that it would be appropriate to authorize public bodies within the Town to permit attendance at public meetings by members of the public bodies via videoconferencing under extraordinary circumstances , and

WHEREAS, upon review of the proposed Local Law, Short Environmental Assessment Form, and related documents and filings, the Board makes the following preliminary determinations:

- 1. The proposed action is one subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA");
- 2. The proposed action as a "Type II" (NYCRR 617.5(21) and (33)) action;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby declares its intention to serve as Lead Agency for the purpose of environmental review under SEQRA.

5. SET PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO MIXED USE DEVELOPMENT AND MIXED USE EXPANSIUON SPECIAL PERMITS / FAST FOOD RESTAURANTS / TOWN CODE 4.32 (O) MIXED USE DEVELOPMENTS / JUNE 27, 2023

RESOLVED that the Town Board will hold a public hearing on June 27 at 7:05 p.m., on a proposed Local Law, to amend Chapter 43, Article IV, Section 4.32(O)(iii)(h) by adding "fast-food restaurants" as a permitted use in mixed-use developments, as such developments are defined therein.

6. DECLARATION OF INTENTION OF TOWN BOARD TO SERVE AS LEAD AGENCY PURSUANT TO SEQRA

WHEREAS, the Town has received an application seeking an amendment to the Town Zoning Law, at Chapter 43, § 4.32(O)(iii)(h), to permit restaurants, including fast food restaurants, as a permitted use in mixed use developments; and

WHEREAS, upon review thereof, the Board makes the following preliminary determinations:

- 1. The proposed Action is one subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA");
- 2. The proposed Action as an "Unlisted" action under SEQRA; and
- 3. The following are involved or interested agencies in the review of the Action under SEQRA:
 - Orangetown Planning Board;
 - Rockland County Department of Planning;
 - Rockland County Sewer District No. 1;
 - Rockland County Drainage Agency;
 - Rockland County Department of Health;
 - N.Y.S. Department of Environmental Conservation;
 - N.Y.S. Department of Transportation; and
 - Palisades Interstate Park Commission (the "PIPC"); and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Amendment must be referred to the Town of Orangetown Planning Board (the "Planning Board") for a report and recommendation, the PIPC, the Rockland County Planning Board, and all other Involved Agencies pursuant to state and/or local law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby declares its intent to serve as Lead Agency for the purpose of environmental review of the Action, and directs that: (i) a Lead Agency Coordination Letter with relevant documents be circulated to and among the various above referenced agencies; (ii) the Zoning Amendment and relevant documents be referred to the Planning Board, the PIPC, the Rockland County Planning Board and all other involved agencies; and (iii) the Special Permit Amendment and relevant documents be referred to the PIPC, the Rockland County Planning Board agencies.

7. APPROVE / ADDITIONAL SERVICES / AKRF, INC. / ORANGETOWN COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

WHEREAS, the Town Board authorized, in Resolution 2021-185, the retention AKRF, Inc., Environmental, Planning and Engineering Consultants, White Plains, New York, to take appropriate measures to assist the Town in preparation of a Comprehensive Plan in accordance with their written proposal dated December 20, 2020 for the estimated fixed fee schedule of \$135,000, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board authorized an amendment to the agreement, in Resolution 2022-51, to add additional public workshops at a cost of \$17,880, and

WHEREAS, AKRF's contract included two Town Board meetings, however, they have attended a total of five Town Board meetings to date, on October 25, 2022, December 13, 2022, January 24, 2023, March 7, 2023 and April, 2023, and

WHEREAS, AKRF's contract included one round of edits following the close of the Public Hearing, however, they have provided three substantive rounds of edits on December, 5, 2022, March 1, 2023, and April 25, 2023, at the request of the Town Board, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby authorizes an amendment to the agreement as approved in Resolutions 2021-185 and 2022-51 to authorize payment of \$12,250, to AKRF, Inc., for additional services requested and incurred, including attendance at extra public hearings (\$2,500) and substantive edits of the comprehensive plan (\$9,750), and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town Board hereby authorizes AKRF, Inc. to provide additional consulting services, not to exceed \$7,500, and that the Supervisor or her designee is authorized to execute any documents necessary to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution, upon review and approval of the Town Attorney's Office.

8. APPROVE / AUTHORIZE TOWN ATTORNEY TO SIGN SETTLEMENT DOCUMENTS / TAX CERTIORARI PROCEEDING COURTLAND REALTY LLC V. THE BOARD OF ASSESSORS, ETC., ET AL. (68.12-2-6)

RESOLVED, upon the recommendation of the Assessor, approve and authorize Dennis D. Michaels, Deputy Town Attorney, to sign settlement documents regarding the tax certiorari proceeding Courtland Realty LLC v. The Board of Assessors, etc., et al., tax map designation 68.12-2-6 (42-62 E. Crooked Hill Rd.), for the tax assessment years 2018 - 2022 for a total refund by the County of \$ 1,130, a total refund by the Town of \$3,505, and a total refund by the School District of \$12,322. Interest on the Town's liability as a result of assessment decrease or refund is waived if payment is made within sixty (60) days after a copy of the order based upon the settlement is served on the Rockland County Finance Department.

9. APPROVE / AUTHORIZE TOWN ATTORNEY TO SIGN SETTLEMENT DOCUMENTS / TAX CERTIORARI PROCEEDING RE. THIBAUT DELILLE AND MILAM LLC V. TOWN OF ORANGETOWN, AND NYACK UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT (TAX LOT #60.78-1-48)

RESOLVED that, upon the recommendation of the Tax Assessor, approve and authorize Robert V. Magrino, Town Attorney, and any of his Deputy Town Attorneys, to sign settlement documents regarding the tax certiorari proceeding Thibaut Delille, and Milam LLC v. Town of Orangetown, and Nyack Union Free School District (NYS Supreme Court, Rockland County, Index Numbers 033119/2020 & 033308/2022), for property commonly known as 235 North Broadway, Nyack (Tax Map Designation 60.78-1-48), for the tax assessment years 2020 through 2022, for a total refund by the Town of \$16,878.00, a total refund by the School District of \$63,769.00, and a total refund by the County of \$8,806.00. Interest on the Town's liability, as a result of a property tax assessment decrease or refund, is waived if payment is made within sixty (60) days after a copy of the Court Order, based upon the settlement, is served on the Rockland County Finance Department.

10. RELEASE OF SMK GREEN SUBDIVISION MONEY HELD IN ESCROW IN LIEU OF PERFORMANCE BOND

WHEREAS, the developer of the SMK Green Subdivision was required and did in fact post money in escrow in lieu of a performance bond in the amount of \$51,975.00 for the completion of certain public improvements related to the subdivision; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board, after receiving recommendations from the Department of Environmental Management and Engineering (DEME) and the Superintendent of Highways, voted pursuant to PB#23-16 to recommend to the Town Board that the above referenced money in escrow in lieu of a performance bond be released; and

WHEREAS, the Town Attorney's Office also recommends that the above referenced money in escrow in lieu of a performance bond be released.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, upon the recommendation of the Planning Board, the Town Highway Department, DEME and the Town Attorney's Office, the Board hereby authorizes the release of the money held in escrow in lieu of a performance bond in the sum of \$51,975.00 to the developer of the SMK Green Subdivision.

14. APPROVE/ LEND ASSISTANCE / 2023 GREEK FESTIVAL / ST. CONSTANTINE'S CHURCH

RESOLVED, upon the recommendation from the Superintendent of Highways & the Chief of Police, that the Town Board hereby authorizes these two departments to lend assistance which includes the use of cones, barricades, trash cans, recycling kiosks & bins, directional & no parking signs from the Highway Dept., and Auxiliary police from OPD, for the Greek Festival to be held from Thursday, June 1 – through Sunday, June 4, from 12pm – 12 am.
