Robert Magrino, Town Attorney, the Town filed a request, with the State Supreme Court, that yielded a temporary restraining order against the hotel. The town maintains that the hotel's land-use permits and certificate of occupancy do not permit it to house up to 300 single men for up to four months. The Town issued violations notices and filed a lawsuit.

Summary of Public Comments:

Christine O'Brien, Stacey Maher, & Mike Mandel, Pearl River; Christopher Gionnett, Piermont; Dina McIntyre, Gerald Verdicchio, Joan Corona, & Felo Castro, Orangeburg; Marie Joyce, & Paul Brauer Blauvelt; Eileen Larkin, Palisades; and Diane Holland, W. Nyack; are against the New York City's plan to house asylum seekers living in Orangetown. They asked, how can a mayor of a different municipal intrude. They are concerned about the safety of existing Orangetown residents and the Town's resources. All migrants coming to the US need to come in legally. They thanked the Town Board for their quick actions

Janice Magistro, Monsey, do not allow Orangetown to turn in Monsey. Monsey is broken and Rockland County cannot afford to house these seekers.

Mary Ironside, Tappan, is in favor of these asylum seekers living in Orangetown. They have already been vetted out. She asked, why is the Town getting involved with who stays at a hotel. Steve Dugandzic, Pearl River, spoke about the Comprehensive Plan.

Joyce Taub, Orangeburg, again expressed her concerns regarding Rockland Cider Work (RCW). Gerry Goggin, Orangeburg, read parts of a resident letter in response to LaBerge's Report regarding RCW.
