FIRST: It is the intent of this Resolution to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Pearl River Fire District in 2024, pursuant to General Municipal Law

section 3-c, and to allow the Pearl River Fire District to adopt a budget for 2024 that may require a

tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law section 3-c.

SECOND: The Board notes that it is the "governing body" of the fire district with the

authority to adopt a budget for calendar year 2024.

THIRD: The Board notes that the annual budget for calendar year 2024 may be determined,

by factors not yet established by other bodies with responsibilities under the law, to be in excess of

permissible limits under said Law.

FOURTH: The Board finds that the 2024 annual budget is necessary and proper to fulfill the

Board's obligations to provide fire protection within the Pearl River Fire District.

FIFTH: The Board resolves and determines to exceed and override the requirements set by

section 3-c of the General Municipal Law for the 2024 calendar year.

SIXTH: That this resolution take effect immediately.
