ACCEPT PETITION/REQUEST FOR ZONING TEXT AMENDMENT / CHAPTER 43 –
MULTIFAMILY DWELLING COMMUNITY FLOATING ZONE-LI/ DIRECT CIRCULATION OF
PROPOSED LOCAL LAW**

WHEREAS, the owner of premises located at 155 South Greenbush Road, Orangeburg, New York, (Tax Lot 74.07 Block 1 Lot 15.2) being located in the "LI" (Light Industrial) zoning district, has petitioned the Town Board to change the text of the Zoning Code by Amending Chapter 43, Articles IV to permit multi family dwelling community on parcels of 10 acres or more as a "floating zone" in the LI zoning district; and

WHEREAS, upon preliminary review, the Town Board is favorably disposed to such a zoning text amendment, because such a floating zone would provide for a transitional use between industrial and residential areas, provide for a range of housing types, is consistent with the Town Comprehensive Plan in that it provides for alternatives to warehouse uses in this district, and is limited to parcels that are 10 acres or more; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board wishes to proceed with its consideration of the proposed action, toward which end it wishes to commence the environmental review process, as well as review by other interested agencies; and

WHEREAS, upon review of the Petition, and a Full Environmental Assessment Form prepared at the Town Board's request by the Office of Building, Zoning, Planning and Administration and Enforcement, and related documents and filings, the Board makes the following preliminary determinations:

1. The proposed action is one subject to review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA");
2. The proposed action as an "Type I" action; and
3. The following are involved or interested or involved agencies in the review process:
 - a) Orangetown Planning Board;
 - b) Rockland County Department of Planning;
 - c) Rockland County Department of Health;
 - d) Town of Clarkstown
 - e) Town of Ramapo
 - f) Village of Piermont
 - g) Village of Nyack
 - h) Village of Chestnut Ridge
 - i) New York State Department of Transportation

RESOLUTION NO. 413**ACCEPT AND EXECUTE A RELEASE AND DEFENSE, INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT/ ROOPA AWAL AND ASHOOK AWAL / 50 WOODS ROAD, PALISADES, NEW YORK (S/B/L: 78.18-1-37)**

WHEREAS, Roopa Awal and Ashook Awal ("Awal") made application to the Town Building Department and the Zoning Board of Appeals ("ZBA") to install and erect fencing along certain boundaries of their real property located at 50 Woods Road, Palisades, New York (S/B/L: 78.18-1-37), requiring variances from: (1) Town Code Chapter 43 §5.226 Fence Height as a 4 ½ foot fence is permitted in the front yard with six (6') foot and eight (8') 8 foot proposed; and (2) Town Code Chapter 43 §5.226 Fence Setback as fences over six (6') foot must be set back from the property lot line a distance equal to two-thirds (2/3) its' height with the fence being proposed on the property line; and

WHEREAS, the Awal submission to the ZBA revealed the existence of a twenty-five (25') foot easement for "future road widening" at the northeast side and at the east side of the premises; yet the Awal's title company has not found any recorded road widening easements to the Town of Orangetown or to the County of Rockland; and

WHEREAS, as a condition of granting approval for the fencing, as set forth in ZBA Decision #25-54 dated April 16, 2025, the Town has required Awal to provide a hold harmless and indemnification agreement in favor of the Town to protect the Town in the event that any recorded or unrecorded easement is later discovered, or any claims are asserted against the Town with respect thereto;

WHEREAS, the Release, and Defense, Indemnification and Hold Harmless Agreement has been reviewed by the Town Attorney's Office, and the Town Attorney's Office recommends that the owner execute and file with the Rockland County Clerk the Release, and Defense, Indemnification and Hold Harmless,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town hereby receives the Release, and Defense, Indemnification and Hold Harmless Agreement executed by Roopa Awal and Ashook Awal; and
