5. **DESIGNATION OF LEAD AGENCY WITH RESPECT TO PROPOSED LOCAL LAW NO. \_\_ OF 2026, AMENDING CHAPTER 14, ARTICLE V OF THE TOWN CODE REGARDING “FEES” AND DETERMINATION UNDER SEQRA**

**RESOLVED**, that the Town Board hereby declares itself to be Lead Agency for environmental review with respect to a proposed Local Law No. \_\_ of 2026, amending Chapter 14 entitled “Fees”, Article V related to Fees in Support of Electronic Record Conversion and GIS, and further determines that such action is a Type II action pursuant to SEQRA (6 NYCRR 617.5(c)(24)(25)(26) and (33), that the action will not have a significant adverse environmental impact, and, therefore, no further action is necessary with respect thereto under the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

6. **ADOPTION OF LOCAL LAW NO. \_\_\_ OF 2025 / AMENDING CHAPTER 14, ARTICLE V OF THE TOWN CODE REGARDING FEES RELATED TO ELECTRONIC STORAGE AND CONVERSION OF RECORDS AND GIS SYSTEM**

**RESOLVED**, that the Town Board hereby adopts proposed Local Law No. \_\_\_ of 2026, by amending Chapter 14, entitled “Fees”, Chapter V to be entitled, as amended, “Fees in Support of Electronic Record Conversion and Storage, and Geographic Information System (GIS) Displaying Certain Land Use and Other Municipal Information”.

LOCAL LAW NO. \_\_\_ - 2026 OF THE TOWN OF ORANGETOWN  
AMENDING TOWN CODE CHAPTER 14, ARTICLE V OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN  
OF ORANGETOWN REGARDING FEES RELATED TO GIS AND ELECTRONIC  
STORAGE OF INFORMATION

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF ORANGETOWN AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1. – Chapter 14, Article V of the Code of the Town of Orangetown entitled “Fees in Support of Geographic Information System (GIS) Displaying Certain Land Use And Other Municipal Information” is hereby amended to read as follows (deletions are ~~strikethrough~~, additions are underlined):**

**Article V Fees in Support of Electronic Record Conversion and Storage, and Geographic Information System (GIS) Displaying Certain Land Use and Other Municipal Information**

**§ 14-13. Establishment of fees.**

Whenever an individual, group of individuals, partnership, firm, association, corporation or entity is required by any other article, chapter, section or subsection of this Code or any other applicable law to pay a fee associated with any of the permits, applications, or departments listed in § 14-14 below, such individual, group of individuals, partnership, firm, association, corporation or entity shall pay an additional fee as set forth by a resolution or resolutions of the Town Board - for purposes of addressing conversion, storage, processing and maintenance of land use records and other municipal information in electronic format and for fees related to the Geographic Information (GIS) System.

**Section 2. Authority**

This proposed Local Law is enacted and adopted pursuant to NYS Municipal Home Rule Law §10, and in accordance with the procedures prescribed in NYS Municipal Home Rule §20.

**Section 3. Severability**

If any section, subdivision, paragraph, clause or phrase of this Local Law shall be adjudged invalid, or held to be unconstitutional, by any court of competent jurisdiction, any judgment or order made thereby shall not affect the validity of this Local Law as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part or provision so adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional.

**Section 4. Effective Date**

This Local Law shall take effect upon publishing and posting a copy in the manner prescribed by applicable laws, and upon filing a copy with the NYS Secretary of State.

7. **APPLY FOR FUNDING / FY2027 COMMUNITY PROJECT FUNDING / FY2027 CONGRESSIONALLY DIRECTED SPENDING / RENOVATIONS TO GREENBUSH ROAD BUILDING TO DEVELOP A SENIOR AND YOUTH CENTER**

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Orangetown, after due consideration, has determined that it is desirable and in the public interest to undertake the necessary activities for the submittal of a grant application under the FY2027 Community Project Funding (CPF) and the FY2027 Congressionally Directed Spending (CDS) programs to develop a senior and youth center at the Greenbush Road building; and,

**WHEREAS**, senior residents currently comprise approximately 27% of the Town's total population, alongside a growing population of young people and families; however, the Town does not have a dedicated, town-owned facility to support comprehensive senior or youth programming and regularly meet in borrowed spaces such as firehouses, churches and synagogues; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Town is seeking up to \$2,409,000 in funding to renovate the 1926 building on Greenbush Road into a multi-room, fully accessible senior and youth center supporting clubs, nutrition services, health and wellness initiatives, and educational programming; and,

**WHEREAS**, FY2027 CPF and CDS assistance will enable the Town to improve community infrastructure that will strengthen public health, reduce isolation, expand youth engagement, and foster connections;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Town Board authorizes and directs the Town Supervisor or her designee to submit an application to the FY2027 Community Project Funding and the FY2027 Congressionally Directed Spending programs to renovate the Greenbush Road building to develop a senior and youth center and to execute all documents necessary for the implementation of this work relating to the financial and/or administrative processes of the grant program; and,

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, to the extent all or any actions hereby authorized have been executed and/or performed by the Supervisor or her designee all are hereby ratified and confirmed and this Resolution take effect immediately.

8. **APPLY FOR FUNDING / NEW YORK STATE ARCHIVES (STATE ARCHIVES) 2026-2027 LOCAL GOVERNMENT RECORDS MANAGEMENT IMPROVEMENT FUND (LGRMIF) (RFP #264) / BUILDING DEPARTMENT DOCUMENT CONVERSION & ACCESS PROJECT**

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Orangetown ("Town"), after due consideration, has determined that it is desirable and in the public interest to undertake the necessary activities for the submittal of a grant application under the 2026-2027 New York State Archives Local Government Records Managements Improvement Fund ("LGRMIF") (RFP #264) for the Building Department Document Conversion & Access Project; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town has completed Phase 1 and Phase 2 of the Building Department Conversion & Access Project through a 2022 -2023 and 2024-2025 LGRMIF grant and is ready to complete Phase 3 of the conversion & access project; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town is seeking up to \$75,000 in funding for Phase 3 as the Building Department has a high-priority backlog of aging historical building records stored in hard-to-reach and unsafe conditions in addition to the added responsibility of managing South Nyack's newly acquired records; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Board is hereby committed to using municipal funds to provide a local cash match and in-kind support of the grant request, including the allocation of 2026 budget items to support the hiring of two part-time assistant clerks to assist with document preparation for consultant, not to exceed \$25,000; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Town Board authorizes and directs the Town Supervisor or her designee to submit an application to the NYS ARCHIVES LGRMIF program for the "Building Department Document Conversion & Access Project" and to execute all documents necessary for the implementation of this work relating to the financial and/or administrative processes of the grant program, subject to review and approval of the Town Attorney's Office.

9. **ADOPT / LGS-1 RETENTION AND DISPOSITION SCHEDULE FOR NEW YORK LOCAL GOVERNMENT RECORDS**

**RESOLVED**, By the Town Board of the Town of Orangetown that Retention and Disposition Schedule for New York Local Government Records (LGS-1), issued pursuant to Article 57-A of the Arts and Cultural Affairs Law, and containing legal minimum retention periods for local government records, is hereby adopted for use by all officers in legally disposing of valueless records listed therein.

**FURTHER RESOLVED**, that in accordance with Article 57-A:

(a) only those records will be disposed of that are described in Retention and Disposition Schedule for New York Local Government Records (LGS-1), after they have met the minimum retention periods described therein;

(b) only those records will be disposed of that do not have sufficient administrative, fiscal, legal, or historical value to merit retention beyond established legal minimum periods.

10. **RESOLUTION REQUESTING A FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR WEST SHORE PASSENGER RAIL SERVICE**

**WHEREAS**, the west side of the Hudson River in Orange, Ulster, and Rockland Counties lacks sufficient public transportation infrastructure, limiting mobility and economic opportunity for residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the CSX River Subdivision (West Shore Line) presents a unique opportunity for a new passenger rail corridor connecting Newburgh, Cornwall, and other west-of-Hudson communities to New York City and the greater metropolitan area; and

**WHEREAS**, All Aboard Hudson Valley envisions implementing passenger rail service along the West Shore Line to support regional goals related to smart growth, access to transportation, economic development, and reduction of carbon emissions; and

**WHEREAS**, recent developments such as the proposed implementation of New York City's congestion pricing plan and the cancellation of the Newburgh-Beacon Ferry have underscored the urgent need for viable commuter alternatives on the west side of the Hudson River; and

**WHEREAS**, a restored and upgraded West Shore rail corridor would not only increase access to jobs and housing but would also support critical hubs such as Stewart International Airport and the potential Newburgh Intermodal Transportation Center, including multimodal connections with ferry, bus, rideshare, and future housing development; and

**WHEREAS**, such service could also provide future connections for tourism to the Catskills, improved access to West Point for events and ceremonies, and long-term opportunities for transit-oriented development in Towns like Orangetown; and

**WHEREAS**, a feasibility study is the critical first step to assess operational, engineering, ridership, and economic viability of such service;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Orangetown Town Board hereby formally requests that New York State, in coordination with relevant regional planning agencies and transportation authorities, and at no cost to the Town, fund and initiate a feasibility study to evaluate the restoration of passenger rail service on the CSX River Subdivision (West Shore Line) with a stop in Orangetown; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Kathy Hochul, Congressman Michael Lawler, State Senator William Weber, Assemblyman Aron Wieder, Assemblyman Patrick Carroll, the New York State Department of Transportation, and other relevant agencies and officials to express our full support and urge immediate action.
