THE TOW N BOAR DO F THE TOW NO FORANGETOWN, IN THE COUNTY OF ROCKLAND, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Town Board) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town of Orangetown, in the County of Rockland, New York (the 'Town"), i s hereb y authorize d t o undertak e preparation of surveys, preliminar y and detaile d plans, specifications and estimates necessary for planning construction of a municipal swimming facility and community center on a portion of the Rockland Psychiatric Center site purchased by the Town fi'o m the State of New York. The estimated maximum cost thereof, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$900,000 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$900,000 bonds of the Town to finance said appropriation, and levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the Town to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Bond s of the Town in the principal amount of \$900,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

- (a) The period of probable usefulness of the object or purpose for which said bonds are authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section U.OO a. 62(2nd) of the Law, is five (5) years.
- (b) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issue distribution of said bonds, may be applied to reimburs either Town for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section LI 50-2 of the United States Treasury Department.
- (c) Th e proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by this resolution will not exceed five years.

Section 4. Eac hof the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Tov/n without limitation as to rate or amount. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest to near door and any notes issued in

anticipation of the sale of said bonds, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the Town by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 5 . Subject to the provision sof this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals thereof, and of Sections 50.00, 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Town Board relative to authorizing the issuance of any notes in anticipation of the sale of the bonds herein authorized, or the renewals thereof, and relative to providing for substantially levelor declining annual debt service, prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, or the renewals of said notes, as well as to executing agreements for credit enhancement, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor, as the chief fiscal officer of the Town.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) suc h obligation s ar e authorize d fo r a n object o r purpos e fo r which the Town is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provision so f law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution, or a summary thereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
 - (c) suc h obligation s ar e authorize d i n violatio n o f th e provision s o f th e constitution.

Section 7 . Thi s bon d resolution shall take effect immediately, and the Town Attorney is hereby authorized and directed to publish the foregoing resolution, in summary, together with a Notice attached in substantially the form prescribed by Section 81.00 of the Law in the "JOURNAL-NEWS," a newspaper published in West Nyack, New York having a general circulation in the Town and hereby designated the official newspaper of said Town for such publication.
