The proposed action is a community aquatic facility and community center. Facilitie s include 4 four swimming pools, and a 35,000 square foot building organized on two levels. A new access road, and two parking areas support facility. Sit e development includes paved pool decks, pedestrian walkways, fencing around pool complex, general site lighting, and landscaping. A second phase of the action includes construction of an open-air pavilion and great lawn area to the south of the pools and building and walking trails through the wooded areas.

Support utility improvements will include storm water handling, sanitary sewer service, water, gas and electrical supply. 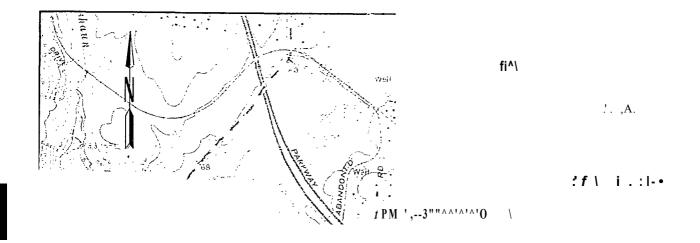

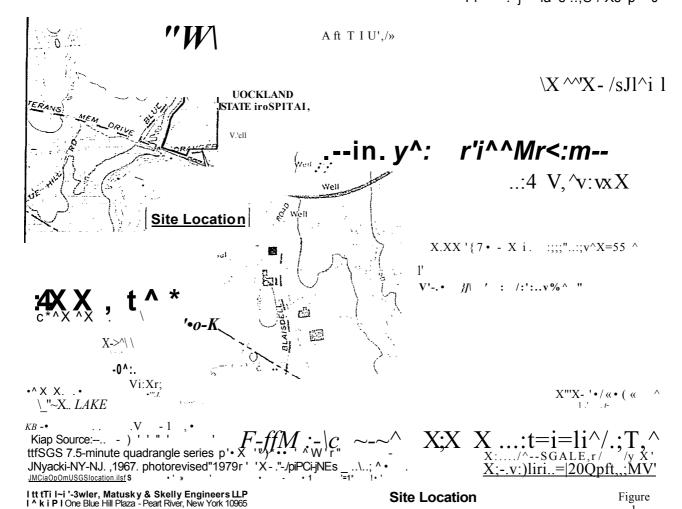

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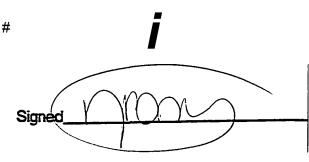
