Dear Town Clerk Sfraga:

We represent Steven Griffin in connection with the above-referenced matter. Enclosed are eight (8) sets of plans, pipe calculations, and check in the amount of \$100 payable to the Town of Orangetown for a watercourse diversion permit.

The Property, which is pending before the Planning Board, is for the construction of a single-family residence. In connection with the site plan approval, Griffin has been asked by the Town Highway Department and Department of Environmental Management and Engineering to relocate an existing 24-inch storm water pipe away from the proposed residence. To that end, Griffin proposes to install a new 36'drainage pipe running approximately 92-feet into a RIPRAP outlet protection. This proposed pipe will be more than 15 feet away from the proposed residence. This new drainage system will eliminate an open ditch condition presently on the site.

We respectfully request that this item be placed on the Town Board agenda for consideration. Please let us know the date of that Town Board meeting. We thank you for your consideration and attention to this mater.

LOCAL LAW TO AMEND CHAPTER 26 OF THE TOWN CODE OF THE TOWN OF ORANGETOWN REGARDING PUBLIC ELECTRIC VEHICLE PARKING SPACES

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF ORANGETOWN AS FOLLOWS:

The said section of the Code, Chapter 26, is amended as follows (Additions to the existing law are **Bold and underline**; Deletions are designated by strikethrough):

Section 1.

§ 26-1. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

BATTERY ELECTRIC VEHICLE

Any vehicle that operates exclusively on electrical energy from an off-board source that is stored in the vehicle's battery(ies), and produces zero tailpipe emissions or pollution when stationary or operating.

CHARGING

When an electric vehicle is connected to electric vehicle supply equipment (or standard outlet) for the purpose of recharging motive batteries on board the electric vehicle.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE

Any motor vehicle that is registered with New York State Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) and is authorized to operate on public and private highways, roads and streets, and operates, either partially or exclusively, on electrical energy from the grid, or an off-board source, that is stored on-board for motive purpose. "Electric vehicle" includes:

- (1) A battery electric vehicle;
- (2) A plug-in hybrid electric vehicle;
- (3) A neighborhood electric vehicle; and
- (4) A medium-speed electric vehicle.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION – PUBLIC USE

An area that is publicly owned and publicly available (e.g. parking spaces on a public street or municipal parking lot), that is served by electric vehicle supply equipment or battery charging station equipment that has as its primary purpose the transfer of electric energy (by conductive or inductive means) to a battery or other energy storage device in an electric vehicle.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE PARKING SPACE

Any marked parking space that is equipped with an Electric Vehicle Charging Station.

MEDIUM-SPEED ELECTRIC VEHICLE

A self-propelled electrically powered four-wheeled motor vehicle, equipped with a roll cage or crush-proof body design, whose speed attainable in one mile is more than 25 miles per hour but not more than 35 miles per hour and otherwise meets or exceeds the Federal regulations set forth in 49 CFR Section 571.500.

NEIGHBORHOOD ELECTRIC VEHICLE

A self-propelled, electrically powered four-wheeled motor vehicle whose speed attainable in one mile is more than 20 miles per hour and not more than 25 miles per hour and conforms to Federal regulations set forth in 49 CFR Section 571.500.

PLUG-IN HYBRID ELECTRIC VEHICLE (PHEV)

An electric vehicle that (1) contains an internal combustion engine and also allows power to be delivered to drive wheels by an electric motor; (2) charges its battery primarily by connecting to the grid or other off-board electrical source; (3) may additionally be able to sustain battery charge using an on-board internal combustiondriven generator; and (4) has electricity-powered travel capability.

§ 26-4. Spaces designated.

G. Certain parking spaces on public streets or in Town owned municipal parking lots shall be designated as Electric Vehicle Parking Spaces by the Town. The Town Board shall establish and may amend the fees, limitations of time and occupancy for the use of the Electric Vehicle Parking Spaces and Electric Vehicle Charging Stations-Public Use, by Town Board Resolution. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained within this Chapter regarding parking meters, fees shall be based upon kilowatt hours per charge plus an applicable surcharge, in addition to a fee for the use of the parking space as determined by the Town Board.

§ 26-15. Violations and penalties; removal of illegally parked vehicles.

D. In addition to any other penalties set forth in this Chapter, vehicles parked in an Electric
 Vehicle Parking Space in violation of this section or as posted with signage installed in accordance with the fees, limitations of time and occupancy established in accordance with this section, may be towed. Any costs associated with towing and storage of a vehicle that is towed pursuant to this section shall be at the vehicle owner's expense.

Section 2. Severability Clause

The invalidity of any word, section, clause, paragraph, sentence, part or provision of this local law shall not affect the validity of any other part of this local law that can be given effect without such invalid parts.

Section 3. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall become effective immediately upon being filed with the Secretary of State.

LOCAL LAW NO. __ OF 2018, AMENDING CHAPTER 43 OF THE TOWN CODE ARTICLE V AND ARTICLE XI TO PROVIDE FOR THE DEFINITION AND REGULATION OF TEMPORARY STORAGE CONTAINERS (PODS)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF ORANGETOWN AS FOLLOWS:

As amended, <u>Additions are underlined</u>, <u>Deletions are stricken</u>. The said section of the Code is amended as follows:

Section 1.

A) ARTICLE V

Section 5.2 Exceptions to bulk regulations

5.229-A

1. Temporary portable storage containers shall be permitted under the provisions of this section. Not more than one container shall be allowed per residential lot. Enclosed containers shall not exceed 128 square feet and eight feet in height. The temporary storage container must be a minimum of 5 feet from any side or rear yard property line; in no instance shall the container be placed in a required front yard, unless in a permitted driveway, nor shall it be placed in a public right-of-way or easement.

2. A permit is required from the Building Inspector for the placement of a temporary portable storage container after being in place for more than 30 days in any 180 day period. The permit shall authorize such container to remain for a period not to exceed 180 days thereafter. Upon application made within 15 days of the expiration of the permit, the Building Inspector may grant a permit to extend the initial 180 day time period for an additional 180 days, provided the applicant has a valid and existing building permit for construction activities at the property, or applies for such a building permit simultaneously with the application for an extension. 3. No permit shall be issued for another temporary storage container for the same residential lot until two years from the issuance of a previously issued permit, except if the ownership of the lot changes.

4. The permit must be displayed in a conspicuous place on the temporary portable storage container.

5. Failure to obtain a permit and/or any container that is situated in violation of an issued permit or this section shall constitute a violation of the zoning code, subject to penalty as per §10.6 of the code. The fee for the permit for the temporary storage container shall be established as per Town Board resolution.

B) ARTICLE XI

Section 11.2 Definitions:

TEMPORARY STORAGE CONTAINER

Any portable container, receptacle, or device of a type commonly used for the temporary storage of personal property and other matter. The term shall include, but not be limited to, portable on-demand storage units (PODS).

Section 2. Severability Clause

The invalidity of any word, section, clause, paragraph, sentence, part or provision of this local law shall not affect the validity of any other part of this local law that can be given effect without such invalid parts.

Section 3. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall become effective immediately upon being filed with the Secretary of State.

Presentation from Orangetown Police Department Detective Mahar addressing various safeguards to avoid being the victim of prevalent scams targeting seniors. Answer questions from board and tenants.

Presentation from Neil O'Sullivan, CPA addressing OHA Financial statements and overall financial condition. Mr. O'Sullivan expresses overall satisfaction with financial profile of OHA. Suggests an increase to \$1,000 for capital asset valuation minimum.

Addendum Below – August 3, 2018

Dear OHA Members,

I would like to thank you for the confidence you showed in me by voting to pay me for the service of project manager to ensure that the Capital Program we established through our new bond was managed professionally.

Unfortunately I have to decline this position. I have been advised by Counsel that this position while I remain a member of this board would be a conflict of interest. Also, if I was to resign my position on the OHA Board to manage the upcoming Capital Projects, I would have to wait two years before I would able to fill that position.

All of this is based on both the Code of Ethics Policy for the Town of Orangetown and also NYS Public Housing Law.

NYS Public Housing Law states(PBG151) : Contracts of an authority for demolition, excavation, construction, alteration, renovation or purchase of materials or supplies shall be in such form and contain such combination of work or trades and such terms and provisions as may be deemed advisable by the authority. All such contracts, except for purchases of materials or supplies, in excess of fifty thousand shall be made on sealed bids, in compliance with a public notice advertised at least once, not less than twenty days before the date set for the receipt of bids.

NYS Public Housing Law states (PBG36) : No member or employee of an authority shall acquire any interest direct or indirect in a project nor shall they have any interest direct or indirect in any contract or proposed contract or services to be furnished or used in connection with any project.

What this means to the OHA Board.

1. I cannot accept this position.

2. It also can be interpreted that we cannot allow a \$50 discount in rent for the two resident board members. The Orangetown Code of Ethics (circa 1976) basically prohibits the compensation or compensatory position of those that serve as an appointment to a voluntary position. For example our two resident members or other Town voluntary appointments that receive compensation whether through payment, or, discount on a service that has direct influence in Town interests whether by the Town or an outside concern.

3. We need to research and find an Attorney to represent the OHA Board on legal matters.

4. We will possibly need to bid our the Architectural work that Jane Slavin did in the past.

My recommendation is that the Board consider meeting and research the retaining of an Attorney so that the board has a legal opinion on the work the board is attempting to do.

I recommend we do not enter into a contract with John Fellenzer Architects for starting the work on the Capital Program until we get a formal opinion in writing for an Attorney we have on retainer. The OHA Board is best protected by having it stated by Counsel we do not have to bid the Architectural work as a service. Joe Jukic, please attach this email to the minutes of June 27th 2018 where it was voted to compensate me for project management work.

The Town of Orangetown, having offices at 26 W. Orangeburg Road, Orangeburg, New York, 10962, hereafter called the "Town" and the organization known as the following and using the mailing address of:

Hereafter called the "ADOPTEE", recognize the need for and desirability of a more attractive and litter-free Town, hereafter known as the "SPOT", and are entering into this Agreement to enable the ADOPTEE to contribute toward the effort of maintaining the appearance of the SPOT. By signature below, the ADOPTEE acknowledges the hazardous nature of the activity and agrees to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. No participants' vehicles may be parked on the travel lanes or shoulders of a highway while engaged in clean-up activities/improvements without prior approval from the Town of Orangetown.
- 2. Activities permitted are of a maintenance nature, including, but not limited to litter pickup, brush control and cutting, tree trimming and planting, and maintaining approved vegetation, except as modified by the Town Representative.
- 3. The ADOPTEE will organize and supervise all activities.
- 4. The ADOPTEE will organize and conduct a "safety briefing". Each day that that work is done in the adopted area, a designated safety person must review the safety checklist and have participants sign the safety signature sheet. The designated safety person's sole responsibility must be assuring the safety of the workers and the traveling public during maintenance activities at the SPOT. If requested, the Town will provide a representative to present the safety the safety briefing for the first meeting, and after that a designated person from the ADOPTEE shall conduct such briefings.
- 5. All participants must attend the safety briefing before participating in the field activity. The briefings should be held on-site to ensure that all participants are in attendance.
- 6. The ADOPTEE will provide for disposal of collected waste from location specified in the permit.
- 7. The ADOPTEE will conduct activities at a frequency which will enhance the attainment of the goal, which is to provide a park-like appearance within the adopted SPOT and fully comply with the above-mentioned "safety checklist." Except as modified by the Town

Representative, minimum frequency of pick-up within the SPOT is four (4) times a year with the first pickup occurring in the April-May "Spring Clean-Up" time period.

- 8. The ADOPTEE will provide seventy-two (72) hour notice to the Town of Orangetown Supervisor's office as to when they are going to do any work on the SPOT. The ADOPTEE will dispose of any and all debris that they collect, as per the instructions of the Town.
- 9. The ADOPTEE participant will sign and date the "Adopt-A-Spot General Release" protecting the Town, to be kept on file in the Town Supervisor's Office for the duration of the time period designated in the application.
- 10. The Town will publicize the execution of this agreement and will highlight it at various periods thereafter.
- 11. The Town will furnish and erect Adopt-A-Spot signs at the adopted SPOT.
- 12. The Town will continue to apply it's assets in the maintenance of the SPOT.
- 13. This agreement shall be for a two year period commencing on 10, 20, and terminating at 12:01 a.m. on 9, 30, 2020.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this agreement, if in the sole judgment of the Town, it is determined that the ADOPTEE is not meeting the terms and conditions of this Agreement, upon 30 days notice, or summarily if based upon unsafe activity, the Town may terminate this agreement as otherwise provided herein, and take such other action as it deems appropriate.

The Town recognizes the ADOPTEE as the adopting organization for the SPOT, and the ADOPTEE accept the responsibility of maintaining the attractive appearance of the adopted facility and of promoting a litter free environment in the community for the term of this agreement.

The relationship of the ADOPTEE to the Town arising out of this agreement shall be that of an independent contractor. Any and all members or employees of the ADOPTEE under this agreement, shall be considered agents of the ADOPTEE, and all claims arising under the workers compensation law of the State of New York on behalf of said employees while so engaged, in any act or omission on the part of the ADOPTEE employees while so engaged in any of the work or services provided to rendered herein, shall be the sole obligation and responsibility of the ADOPTEE. The ADOPTEE shall secure worker's compensation insurance, for the benefit of, and keep insured during the life of this agreement, such ADOPTEE employees engaged therein, as are required to be insured by the provisions of the worker's compensation law.

The ADOPTEE will, at its own expense and during the term of the Adopt-A-Spot program, maintain comprehensive general liability insurance in the amount of one million dollars combined single limit name the Town of Orangetown as an additional named insured.

Said policy shall expressly require 30 days written notice to the Town of Orangetown of the cancellation or material alteration of said policy and the certificate of insurance shall so provide.

The ADOPTEE hereby agrees to defend, indemnify, save and hold harmless the Town of Orangetown, and all other agents and employees from any and all claims, demands, actions, or cause of action or whatsoever nature or character arising out of or by reason of the execution or performance of work and services provided for herein, including all reasonable expenses incurred by the Town of Orangetown from said claims and further agrees to defend at its own cost and expense any action or proceed commencement for the purpose of asserting any claim whatsoever character arising hereunder.





AGREEMENT TO EXTEND INDEXED LUMP SUM MUNICIPAL SNOW AND ICE AGREEMENT

This Agreement made this ______day of _____, by and between THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK (hereinafter referred to as "STATE"), acting by and through the Commissioner of Transportation of the State of New York (hereinafter referred to as "COMMISSIONER"), and the ______ of the Town of Orangetown of (hereinafter referred to as "MUNICIPALITY") as follows:

WHEREAS, the COMMISSIONER and the MUNICIPALITY have entered into an Agreement No. D009818 entitled "Indexed Lump Sum Snow and Ice Agreement between the New York State Department of Transportation and the Municipality of Town of Orangetown dated January 16, 1996;and

WHEREAS, the term of the said Agreement is for a period of three years commencing July 1,1995 and the said Agreement provides that the parties may at the end of each year of the term of the Agreement extend such term for an additional year; and

WHEREAS, the present term of the Agreement, as extended, expires June 30, 2018; and

WHEREAS, Section 7 of the said Agreement provides that the COMMISSIONER shall furnish the MUNICIPALITY with a suitable map for each term of the Agreement, or for any extended term thereof, modified to show the changes, if any, to the State Highways affected by this Agreement.

WHEREAS, Section 9 of the said Agreement provides for an annual update of the estimated expenditure to be determined by the COMMISSIONER subject to the provisions of Section 9 at the time for extension of the Agreement;

WHEREAS, Section 9 of the said Agreement also provides for an adjustment to the actual payment amount based on the intensity and severity of the winter season;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and benefits between the parties,

WITNESSETH:

1. The aforementioned "Indexed Lump Sum Snow and Ice Agreement Between New York State Department of Transportation and the MUNICIPALITY" is hereby extended for a period of one year; now to expire on June 30, **2019**, unless further extended.

2. The State Highways or parts thereof affected by this Agreement are as delineated on the attached map, agreed upon by the COMMISSIONER and the MUNICIPALITY, which shall be effective for the remainder of the term of the Agreement commencing July 1, **2018**, unless changed by future agreement between the COMMISSIONER and the MUNICIPALITY.

3. All the terms and conditions of the original contract remain in effect except as follows. The indexed lump sum estimated expenditure specified in Section 9 of the aforementioned Agreement shall be <u>\$229,019,82</u> for <u>62,50</u> lane miles for the <u>2016/17</u> season and for the remainder of the term of the Agreement commencing July 1, <u>2016</u>, unless changed by future update.



Dear Mr. Dean:

I submitted a supplemental for your consideration and approval in April 2017 based on the latest schedule from Jorrey Construction, which indicated they anticipated completing the construction by June 2, 2017. As you know, construction activities and inspection continued on a full time basis through August 11th 2017. Since August 11th, there has been minor activity including the testing of sidewalks that were placed the previous November without adequate cold weather protection, and then final inspection associated with punch list work the Contractor performed during December 2017. Miscellaneous closeout activities have been progressed. To date we have accumulated charges that exceed the latest construction phase budget by \$35,305.26. If the design underrun is taken into consideration, our total overrun to date is currently \$15,377. This does not include a considerable amount of time that has been worked and not charged in an attempt to wrap up this project and complete the closeout without driving the costs higher. Allowing for another 80 hours of billable time for closeout activities, I estimate a total of \$48,000 will be needed to cover the construction phase overrun. Once again, this total may be able to be reduced by almost \$20,000 if the design underrun funds can be utilized.

Lochner has continued to perform inspection services accruing charges above the contract maximum amount payable based on the understanding the Town would pay for these services and back charge the Contractor who did not uphold contractual obligations regarding the schedule. As a reminder, \$50,000 was withheld from Contractor Payment Application 7 for estimated Engineering Charges. As the actual Engineering Charges total \$103,271.52 since May 2, 2017, the calculated last day of contract work without Engineering Charges or Liquidated Damages, an additional \$53,271.52 was withheld from Contractor Payment Application 8. I am forwarding this supplemental agreement to request the additional funds that are required to cover our costs accumulated to date and through the closeout period. Also recognize I have extended the contract date to December 31, 2018 as I expect the closeout will extend through this timeframe.

If the proposed contract modifications are acceptable, please sign Attachment A in the designated location and return a signed original for our records. Please call if you have any questions or would like to discuss the proposed contract modifications.

I'm forwarding this letter as documentation for the Engineering Charges that are being levied against Jorrey Excavating, Inc. as a result of the missed completion date for the referenced project.

The original Notice to Proceed was made on May 17, 2016. Contract requirements were to complete the work within 180 consecutive calendar days from the NTP. Since the Notice to Proceed was made on May 17, 2016, the completion date was November 13, 2016. As previously documented in a letter sent to you dated April 8, 2017, the Contractor was granted 36 additional days due to additional work that was added to the project. Included within the 36 additional days was an allotment for 4 additional days for the need to utilize the offsite detour, and 8 days to construct an additional bus shelter at Sta. 137+25 left and remove the barrier curb in front of the shelter at Sta. 137+25 right. Because the offsite detour was never used during 2017 and the bus shelter and curb work was never progressed at Sta. 137+25, the allotted 36 day extension will be shortened by 12 days. Acknowledging there was extra work required when you returned in 2017 to complete the work, we are adding 2 days for the construction of the retaining wall, 2 days for pipe extensions at DS-1A, DS-4A and DS-15A, and a half day for steps at house no. 28. These time allotments are based on inspector reports. The final time extension without Engineering Charges or liquidated damages has been calculated to be 36 days -4 days(offsite detour) -8 days(bus shelters) +5 days(additional work) yielding a 29 day extension.

Allowing 29 additional weekdays (exclusive of holidays) to the contract yields a completion date of December 27, 2016. The contract between the Town and your company would allow the Town to assess Engineering Charges or liquidated damages beginning December 28th. However, based on our records, the last day the Contractor actively worked on the project in 2016 was December 16th. Therefore, as an accommodation to Jorrey Excavating and without waiving its rights, the Town agrees that six weekdays will be allowed in 2017 without any Engineering Charges or liquidated damages. With work resuming on April 24, 2017, Engineering Charges have been applied beginning on May 2, 2017.

Jorrey Excavating substantially completed the field work on August 11, 2017. The punch list work was completed on December 12, 2017.

We represent Steven Griffin in connection with the above-referenced matter. Enclosed are eight (8) sets of plans, pipe calculations, and check in the amount of \$100 payable to the Town of Orangetown for a watercourse diversion permit.

The Property, which is pending before the Planning Board, is for the construction of a single-family residence. In connection with the site plan approval, Griffin has been asked by the Town Highway Department and Department of Environmental Management and Engineering to relocate an existing 24-inch storm water pipe away from the proposed residence. To that end, Griffin proposes to install a new 36'drainage pipe running approximately 92-feet into a RIPRAP outlet protection. This proposed pipe will be more than 15 feet away from the proposed residence. This new drainage system will eliminate an open ditch condition presently on the site.

We respectfully request that this item be placed on the Town Board agenda for consideration. Please let us know the date of that Town Board meeting. We thank you for your consideration and attention to this mater.



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PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT

(EMPLOYEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM)

THIS AGREEMENT, made and executed as of this 1st day of October 2018 between Montefiore Nyack Hospital (the "Hospital") a non-profit acute care hospital located at 160 N. Midland Avenue, Nyack, NY 10960 and the Town of Orangetown (the "Company").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Hospital provides Employee Assistance Programs to outside Employers; and

WHEREAS, the Company is in need of such programs for its employees; and WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Hospital and the Company to agree on the terms pursuant to which Hospital will provide such Services to Company; NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions herein contained and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Hospital and the Company agree as follows:

1. SERVICES

The Hospital shall provide the following services:

- A) Annual <u>All</u> employee Orientation Meetings to promote the program.
- B) Annual Supervisory Training sessions to inform and educate managers to the Employee Assistance Program's Supervisory Referral process.
- C) All promotional materials including, but not limited to, Employee Assistance Program posters, brochures, paycheck stuffers, employee promotional letter and other promotional correspondence.
- D) Professional assessment, consultation and referral services as necessary to troubled employees and/or their families.
- E) Quarterly reports to designated individuals to include utilization rates and other non-identifying demographic information.
- F) Monthly reports to designated individuals of all employees referred by
 Supervisors for poor job performance (Supervisory Referrals) indicating whether
 the employee is or is not in treatment. No further details will be provided unless
 the employee in treatment signs an appropriate release.

Other services not covered herein must be separately negotiated by the parties.

2. TERM OF AGREEMENT AND TERMINATION

This Agreement shall commence as of the 1st day of October 2018 and shall continue in full force and effect for a period of one year(s). Said term shall automatically be extended for successive one (1) year periods thereafter unless terminated by either party hereto as permitted by the terms of this Agreement. Either party may terminate this Agreement by giving not less than thirty (30) days prior written notice of the intention to terminate this Agreement, unless the parties mutually consent to a shorter notice period or as otherwise set forth herein.

3. COMPENSATION FOR SERVICES

Company shall pay Hospital for Services rendered in accordance with the fee schedule attached hereto as Exhibit A, and incorporated herein by reference.

4. GENERAL PROVISIONS

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- A. Indemnity. Company and Hospital agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other party, including, as applicable, its shareholders, officers, directors, employees and agents, from and against any and all liabilities, losses, damages, claims, causes of action and expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees), whenever arising or incurred, that are caused or asserted to have been caused, directly or indirectly, by or as a result of the acts or omissions of that party, its officers, directors, employees and/or agents and/or such party's breach of this Agreement. The indemnification provided under this paragraph shall supplement and not supersede or replace any protection or rights that may be afforded to either party under any insurance policies maintained by the parties that provide coverage for an act that may serve as a basis for a claim of indemnification hereunder.
- B. **Compliance with Law.** The Hospital and the Company shall each comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations and policies with respect to the performance of this agreement, including, but not limited to, rights relative to confidentiality, privacy, quality of care rendered, consumer protection and the like.
- C. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be interpreted, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New York applied without giving effect to any conflict-of-laws principles.

- D. Modifications. This instrument contains the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes any and all prior agreements between the parties, written or oral, with respect to the transactions contemplated hereby. The Agreement may not be changed or terminated orally but may only be changed by a written agreement signed by the parties against whom enforcement of any waiver, change, modification, extension, discharge, or termination is sought.
- E. Notices. Any notice required or permitted hereunder or any agreement or document executed and delivered in connection with this Agreement shall be deemed to have been served properly if hand delivered to an authorized representative or recipient or mailed by certified or registered United States mail or by overnight express, postage or charges prepaid, or by facsimile if such facsimile transmission permits confirmation to the addresses or facsimile numbers listed below, and properly addressed to the respective party to whom such notices relate at the following address:

It is expressly understood that the systems, methods, procedures, policies, manuals, other written materials and controls, developed or employed by Hospital and Company in the performance of this Agreement are proprietary in nature, shall remain the property of the Hospital or Company and shall not, at any time, be utilized, distributed, copied, or otherwise employed or acquired by the other party except during the term of this Agreement, unless prior written approval is obtained from the party owning the information. *This provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement*.

- G. Non Discrimination. Both parties to this Agreement shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations, in that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, creed, religion, sexual orientation, national origin, age, sex, marital status, blindness, source of payment or sponsorship, or disability, be excluded from participation in, be denied benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination under any program, service, employment relationship, or activity offered by either party.
- H. Assignment and Binding Effect. Neither party shall have the right to assign or delegate its obligations hereunder without the prior written consent of the other party. Notwithstanding, the foregoing, all covenants, conditions, and obligations contained herein shall be binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of permitted successors and assigns of Company and Hospital.
- I. NYCRR400.4 Notwithstanding any other provision in this Agreement, each party remains responsible for ensuring that any service provided by it pursuant to this Agreement complies with all pertinent provisions of Federal, State and local statutes, rules and regulations.



INFORMATION FOR BIDDERS

1. Definitions

Whenever the following words and expressions are used in these specifications, it is understood that they have the meanings given below:

Owner	Town of Orangetown as represented by its duly authorized representatives, also known as "Highway Department" and "Department of Environmental Management and Engineering."
Engineer	The term "Engineer" means the Superintendent of Highways, the Town of Orangetown's Department of Environmental Management and Engineering or its duly authorized representative.
Bidder	Any individual, firm or corporation submitting a proposal for the work C contemplated, acting directly or through a duly authorized representative.
Contractor	Party of the second part to the contract, acting directly or through his agents or employees. On the various bonds, the Contractor is also called the Principal.
Contract Documents	Means this contract and shall include the advertisement, the information for bidders, the Bid, the consent of surety, the forms of bonds, the contract, the specifications, the contract drawings, the addenda and the notice of award.
Work	The term "work" is used to designate the equipment, materials and things required to be done, furnished or performed by the Contractor under the Contract Documents attached hereto.
Bid or Proposal	The approved prepared form on which the bidder is to submit or has submitted a proposal for the work contemplated.
Surety	The corporate body which is bound with and for the Contractor and which engages to be responsible for his acceptable performance of the work for which he has contracted.
Performance Bond	The approved form of security furnished by Contractor and his surety as a guarantee of the completion of the project.
Bid Bond	The security to be furnished by the bidder as guarantee of his ability to procure the minimum equipment and liquid assets specified and that he will enter into a contract with the "Owner" for the performance of the work, if the work involved in the proposal is awarded to him.
Labor and Materials Payment Bon	The approved form of security furnished by the Contractor and his surety as a guarantee of the payment of all employees and material men.

- Specifications The body of directions, requirements, etc., contained in this documents, together with all documents of any description and agreements made (or to be made), pertaining to the methods, (or manner) of performing the work, or the quantities and quality (as shown by test records) of accepted materials to be furnished under this contract. Specifications shall also include the Notice to Bidders, Proposal, Contract Agreement and Bond, and any Addenda issued.
- Contract The agreement covering the performance of the work and the furnishing of materials in the construction of the project. It shall include the Notice to Bidders, Instructions to Bidders, Proposal, Contract, General and Specific Contract Conditions and Bid Bonds, Plans or Drawings, Specifications, Addenda and any and all other writings necessary to complete the project.

Project The improvement set forth in the plans and specifications and all additions thereto.

- Completion The word 'completion' shall mean full and exact compliance and conformity with the provisions and requirements expressed or implied in the specifications and the plans, accompanying and forming a part of the same, including all amendments, revisions, corrections or additions, duly authorized.
- Sub-Contractor An individual, firm or corporation having a direct contract with the Contractor or with any other Sub-contractor for performance of a part of the work of this project.
- 2. Receipt and Opening of Bids

The Town of Orangetown, Rockland County, New York, herein called the "Owner", invites proposals on the forms attached hereto, all blanks on which must be filled in appropriately. Proposals shall be received by the Owner at Town Hall, No. 26 Orangeburg Road, Orangeburg, New York until 10:30 A.M. on <u>August 9, 2018</u> and will be publicly opened and read aloud at 11:00 A.M. The envelopes containing the proposals must be sealed, addressed to the Town Clerk, Town of Orangetown, No. 26 Orangeburg Road, Orangeburg, New York, and are to be designated as "Bids for GREENBUSH ROAD BICYCLE BYPASS, BLAUVELT, NEW YORK."

The Owner may consider informal any proposal not prepared and submitted in accordance with the provisions hereof and may waive any informalities in, or reject any and all proposals. Any proposal received after the time and date specified shall not be considered.

3. Preparation of Bid

Bids must be submitted on the prescribed form.

All bids must be submitted in sealed envelopes bearing on the outside the name of the bidder, his address, and the name of the project for which the proposal is submitted. (If forwarded by mail, the sealed envelope containing the proposal, and marked as directed above, must be enclosed in another envelope addressed as specified in the Bid Form, preferably by Certified

Mail.) If mailed, it is the Bidder's responsibility to insure that the bid is received prior to 10:30 A.M., <u>August 9, 2018</u>.

4. Modification of Bids

Any Bidder may modify his bid by written or telegraphic communication provided such communication is received by the Owner prior to the scheduled closing time for receipt of Bids. The communication should not reveal the bid price but should provide the addition or subtraction or other modification so that the final prices or terms will not be known by the Owner until the original bid is opened.

5. Withdrawal of Bids

A Bid may be withdrawn prior to the scheduled time for the opening of bids by written request or in person. No bid may be withdrawn after the time scheduled for bid opening unless the forty-five (45) days specified in the Article "AWARD OF CONTRACT" of these INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS shall have elapsed.

6. Qualifications of Bidder

The Owner may make such investigations as he deems necessary to determine the ability of the bidder to perform the work, and the bidder shall furnish to the Owner all such information and data for this purpose as the Owner may request. The Owner reserves the right to reject any proposal if the evidence submitted by, or investigation of, such bidder fails to satisfy the Owner that such bidder is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract and to complete the work contemplated herein. Conditional proposals will not be accepted.

7. Subcontractor

A. Bidders are advised that the lowest responsible bidder will be required, upon request of the Owner, and within three (3) days of such request to submit a list of subcontractors proposed for the performance of the work. Alternate subcontractors may be included in the list, provided that the use of such alternate subcontractors approved by the Owner shall not result in any change in the contract prices stated in the Proposal.

B. If requested by the Engineer, he shall also furnish a statement as to the subcontractor's experience, financial ability or other qualifications for properly performing the work proposed to be subcontracted. The Owner reserves the right to limit the total amounts of subcontracts to thirty-five (35) percent of the total contract price.

8. Debarments, Suspensions And Voluntary Exclusions

The award of contracts or subcontracts is specifically forbidden to any firm or individual listed on the USEPA Master List of debarments, suspensions and voluntary exclusions. The Contractor, if intending to award subcontracts should contact the Owner who will in turn ascertain from the NYSDEC whether any individual or firm under consideration is currently listed.

9. Award Of Contract

A. Within forty-five (45) days after the opening of Bids, unless otherwise stated in the INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS or GENERAL CONTRACT CONDITIONS, award of the Contract will be made to the lowest, responsive, responsible Bidder.

In order to be considered responsive, a Bid must:

- 1. Conform in all respects to the conditions in the Invitation to Bid and these Instructions to Bidders;
- 2. Conform in all respects to the requirements in all Attachments contained in the Contract Documents;
- B. In order to be considered responsible, a Bidder must establish to the complete satisfaction of the Owner as a minimum that he has:
- 1. Adequate financial resources to meet his Contract obligations and maintain them for the Contract period;
- 2. Adequate equipment to perform the work properly and within the time prescribed in the Contract;
- 3. The necessary experience and technical qualifications in the type of work provided for in the Contract.
- C. The Owner reserves the right to reject all Bids, or any bid not in compliance with the Contract Documents, and to waive any informalities in Bids received.

10. Bid Bond

Each bid shall be accompanied by a check or a bid bond executed by a surety company acceptable to the Owner in an amount not less than five percent (5%) of the amount bid, conditioned that if the bid is accepted, the Bidder will enter into a contract for the work and he will execute such further security as may be required for the faithful performance of the contract.

11. Liquidated Damages for Failure to Enter into Contract

12. Pre-work Conference

Any and all such interpretations and any supplemental instructions will be in the form of written addenda to the Contract Documents, which if issued, will be mailed to all prospective bidders at the respective addresses furnished for such purposes not later than three (3) days prior to the date fixed for the opening of proposals. Failure of any bidder to receive any such addendum or interpretation shall not relieve any bidder from any obligation under his proposal submitted. All addenda so issued shall become part of the Contract Documents.

17. Security for Faithful Performance

Simultaneously with his delivery of the executed contract, the Contractor shall furnish a surety bond in an amount at least equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price, as security for faithful performance of this contract and for the payment of all persons performing labor on the project under this contract and furnishing materials in connection with this contract, in such form as acceptable to the Town Attorney. The surety bond shall include a provision for maintenance as set forth in the agreement.

18. Power of Attorney

Attorneys-in-fact who sign bid bonds or contract bonds must file with each bond a certified copy of their power of attorney to sign said bids.

19. Laws and Regulations

The bidder's attention is directed to the fact that all applicable State, and Municipal Laws, and rules and regulations of all authorities having jurisdiction over construction work in the locality of the project shall apply to the contract throughout, and they are deemed to be included herein the same as though herein written out in full.

All contractors actually undertaking the work required shall save and hold harmless the Town of Orangetown from any and all costs, fees, disbursements, attorneys fees and damages (actual, consequential, or exemplary), awarded in any manner whatsoever through suit, settlement or otherwise, arising out of any claims, suit, action or dispute involving wages paid to all subcontractors, employees, independent contractors, or other persons employed by an contractor employed by the Town of Orangetown

This contract may not be assigned by the contractor or its right, title and interest therein assigned, transferred, conveyed, sublet or otherwise disposed of without the previous consent in writing of the Town of Orangetown and any attempts to assign the contract without the Town's written consent shall be deemed a breach thereof.

The Town shall have no liability under this contract to the contractor or anyone else beyond the funds appropriated and available for the contract. This contract shall be void and of no force and effect unless the contractor shall provide and maintain coverage during the life of this contract for the benefit of such employees as are required to be covered by the provisions of the Workers Compensation Law. Failure to do so shall constitute a breach of this contract.

The contractor must maintain complete and accurate books, records, documents, accounts and other evidence directly pertinent to the performance under this contract hereinafter collectively called the records. The records must be kept for the balance of the calendar year in which they were made and for six additional years thereafter.

In addition to the methods of service allowed by the New York State Civil Practice Law and Rules, the contractor consents to service of process upon it by certified mail, return receipt requested. Service hereunder shall be completed upon the contractor's actual receipt of process or upon the Town's receipt of the return thereof by the United States Postal Service as refused or undeliverable. The Contractor must promptly notify the Town in writing of each and every change of address to which service or process can be made. Service by the Town to the last known address shall be sufficient. The Contractor will have thirty calendar days after service hereunder as complete in which to respond.

20. Lowest Qualified Bidders and Award of Work

Only qualified bidders who have adequate experience, finances, equipment and personnel will be considered in making awards. An award will be made to the lowest qualified bidder, except that the Owner reserves the right to waive any informalities in and reject any and all proposals, or to make an award to other than the low bidder or to advertise for new proposals, if it be deemed to be in the best interests of the Town of Orangetown to do so.

21. Time for Completion

The attention of the bidder is directed to the General Contract Conditions and to Article 33 entitled "Time of Commencement and Completion", bound with and forming part of the Contract Documents.
