**WHEREAS**, this proposed local law has been coordinated with the Highway Department and the Police Department;

**WHEREAS,** the Highway Department and Police Department recommend that the Town Board adopt this proposed local law amending the Town Code;

**RESOLVED,** the proposed local law, amending Chapter 39 entitled Vehicles and Traffic of the Town Code, relating to weight restrictions on Oak Tree Road in the Hamlet of Tappan, is hereby adopted.

#### **TOWN OF ORANGETOWN**

LOCAL LAW NO. \_\_\_ - 2017

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Orangetown as follows:

#### Section 1. Title.

A Local Law amending Chapter 39 (Vehicles and Traffic), Article I (Vehicle and Traffic Regulations) of the Code of the Town of Orangetown.

#### Section 2. Amend Chapter 39, by adding the following section:

39-11.3 Weight Limits on Oak Tree Road in the Hamlet of Tappan

It shall be unlawful for trucks of the following descriptions to travel over Oak Tree Road from Route 303 to Main Street:

- A. Trucks with two axles having a gross weight of vehicle plus load in excess of eight tons;
- B. Trucks with three axles having a gross weight of vehicle plus load in excess of twelve tons; and
- C. Trucks with four axles having a gross weight of vehicle plus load in excess of sixteen tons.

#### Section 6. Effective date.

The provisions of this local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

29. WHEREAS, the Rockland Gaelic Athletic Association was established in 1972; and

**WHEREAS,** the Rockland Gaelic Athletic Association maintains a recreational sports complex offering programs for local athletes of all ages. Specifically offering Gaelic football, hurling, and camogie sports programs for boys, girls, men and women, in addition to hosting competitions, summer camps and more; and

**WHEREAS,** the members of the Rockland County Gaelic Athletic Association desire to designate the road leading to the Association's Orangeburg sports complex as a private road in honor of a historic Irish figure, and to assist first responders during their response to an emergency on the fields; and

**WHEREAS**, Rockland County 9-1-1 Emergency Services have worked with the Rockland Gaelic Athletic Association's officers to identify primary ingress and egress that if named would assist first responders when they are dispatched by the Orangetown Police Department to an emergency at the Association's Orangeburg sports complex; and

**WHEREAS**, the Rockland Gaelic Athletic Association members have requested that said private road, as identified on the attached site map, be named Bobby Sands Way; and

**WHEREAS,** Bobby Sands was born in 1954 in Rathcoole, Ireland, a suburban village, near Belfast, Ireland; and

**WHEREAS,** in October 1972, Bobby Sands was arrested and spent three years in the cages of Long Kesh Prison as a political prisoner; and

**WHEREAS**, upon his release in 1976 Bobby Sands returned to his family in Twinbrook, Ireland, set himself to work tackling the social issues which affected the Twinbrook area, and become a respected community activist; and

**WHEREAS**, within six months Bobby Sands was arrested again, taken to Castlereagh and subjected to brutal interrogations for six days; returned to jail, spending the first twenty-two days of his sentence in solitary confinement; and then following the breakdown of talks between the British direct ruler and the Irish Catholic primate, Bobby Sands, along with seven other prisoners began a hunger strike in protest of Great Britain's treatment of political prisoners, and its occupation of Ireland; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1981, while in prison, Bobby Sands was elected as a Member of Parliament; and

**WHEREAS**, Bobby Sands and his nine comrades died on Hunger Strike in the H-Blocks of Long Kesh Prison so that Ireland's 800 years of struggle for Irish freedom and unity would not be criminalized by an oppressive English government; and

**WHEREAS,** the deaths of Bobby Sands and the other Hunger Strikers was the precursor to the Good Friday Agreement; and

**WHEREAS**, the Rockland Gaelic Athletic Association members are desirous of recognizing Bobby Sands ultimate sacrifice by designating a private road so that future generations will remember his sacrifice; and

**WHEREAS,** the Gaelic Athletic Association expressly acknowledge that the private road shall not owned nor maintained by the Town of Orangetown; and

**WHEREAS**, the Gaelic Athletic Association acknowledge that the Town of Orangetown has standardized requirements for street signs, and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Town Board of the Town of Orangetown hereby authorizes and directs that the private road consisting of Orangetown Tax Lot Section 73.12 Block 1 Lot 1 shall be forever named and known as "Bobby Sands Way", and all future maps depicting said area shall indicate the naming of this private road as "Bobby Sands Way"; and authorizes and directs that any such street sign posted shall follow the Town of Orangetown Highway Department "Requirements for Street Sign Specifications".







### AMENDMENT TO PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAXES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT (the "Amendment"), dated as of February \_\_\_, 2017, by and between CEROVENE, INC., a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Delaware ("Cerovene"), MEDLANTIS LLC, a limited liability company organized and existing under the laws of the State of New Jersey ("Medlantis"), the TOWN OF ORANGETOWN, New York (the "Town"), the PEARL RIVER SCHOOL DISTRICT, Pearl River, New York (the "School District"), and the COUNTY OF ROCKLAND INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY, a New York public benefit corporation (the "Agency"), amends that Payment In Lieu of Taxes Agreement (the "Original Agreement") among the parties hereto dated as of April 1, 2014.

WHEREAS, the parties hereto entered into the Original Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties acknowledge that since entering into the Original Agreement factors beyond the control of the parties have caused a delay in the development and start-up of operations at the affected property; and

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed that such delay has caused unforeseen hardship to Cerovene and Medlantis and a failure of the expectations of the parties hereto as to the appropriate assessed values that were agreed upon, and as a result of such hardship a modification of the schedule of assessed values set forth in the Original Agreement is reasonable and justified;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree to amend the Original Agreement as follows:

- 1. Section 7 of the Original Agreement is amended to replace in the table for year 6 (under the heading "Tax Year During PILOT Period"), the amount of \$1,700,000 (under the heading "Schedule of Values (Deemed Assessed Value For Purposes of Calculating Town and School District PILOT Payments") with the amount of \$1,225,000.
- 2. Except as modified by this Amendment, the Original Agreement remains in full force and effect.
- 3. The amendment made hereby shall become effective, retroactive to the original date of the Original Agreement, immediately upon completion of the execution and delivery of this Amendment by all of the parties hereto.

# A G R E E M E N T BY AND BETWEEN HI-TOR ANIMAL CARE CENTER AND THE TOWN OF ORANGETOWN FOR YEAR 2017

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into the \_\_\_\_\_ day of February, 2017, pursuant to the provisions of Article 7 of the Agriculture and Markets Law, by and between HI-TOR ANIMAL CARE CENTER, INC., a domestic not-for-profit corporation, created and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of New York and having its office and principal place of business at 65 Firemen's Memorial Drive, in the Town of Ramapo, County of Rockland, State of New York, (hereinafter called "HI-TOR"), and the TOWN OF ORANGETOWN, a municipal corporation of the State of New York, having its principal place of business at 26 Orangeburg Rd., Orangeburg, New York 10962, (hereinafter the "TOWN").

#### WITNESSETH:

In consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>TERM:</u> This agreement will commence January 1, 2017 and shall continue through December 1, 2017.
- 2. <u>FEE:</u> The **TOWN** shall pay to **HI-TOR** the sum of THIRTY THREE THOUSAND AND 00/100 (\$33,000.00) DOLLARS per anum, which sum shall be paid to **HI-TOR** quarterly at the sum of EIGHT THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY (\$8,250.00) DOLLARS for the shelter and care of all seized, lost, strayed or homeless animals, including feral cats, delivered by the **TOWN'S** employees and **TOWN** residents, to **HI-TOR** for impoundment and disposition.
- 3. <u>PAYMENTS:</u> The total **TOWN** payments provided for herein shall be paid to **HI-TOR** on a quarterly basis, *in arrears*, with the first payment due on March 31<sup>st</sup> for the quarter commencing January 1.
  - a. Payment shall be contingent upon HI-TOR's submission, and the TOWN's review and approval, of all required documentation to include the HI-TOR Animal Intake Forms, NYS AML "DL-18" forms, and revenues received for that quarter. Provided, however, the TOWN, in its sole discretion, may earlier release to HI-TOR all, or a portion, of any quarterly payment, upon reasonable assurance that the required

documents will be produced, in a timely fashion, and, upon HI-TOR'S compliance with all other terms of this Agreement.

- b. Notwithstanding the aforesaid, the **TOWN** reserves the right to withhold quarterly payments to **HI TOR** until such time as all documentation and revenues have been properly accounted for.
- c. The **TOWN** further reserves the right to reduce quarterly payments for expenses incurred for necessary euthanasia services not available by **HI-TOR** at the time such services are required, in the sole discretion of the Animal Control Officer.
- 4. <u>ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER(S)</u>: The **TOWN** will employ such Animal Control Officer(s) as, in its sole discretion, it deems necessary for the proper implementation of the letter and spirit of its obligations under Article 7 of the Agriculture and Markets Law, but the **TOWN** shall not obligated to budget or spend any funds beyond those actually appropriated for the purpose of implementation Article 7.

#### 5. ACCESS:

- a. The shelter shall be available to the Animal Control Officer(s), Highway Department workers, TOWN Police Department Officers, and any other duly authorized agents of the TOWN at ALL times and during ALL hours of operation;
- b. HI-TOR agrees to provide a list of employee emergency contact numbers and keys to the facility to the Animal Control Officer(s), TOWN Police Department, and other authorized agents as designated by the TOWN.
- c. The shelter shall be available to ORANGETOWN Residents, (with valid proof of residency), during all of the hours of operations open to the public for routine receptions, and at all other times as hereinafter provided.
- 6. <u>COMPLETION OF FORM DL18:</u> The Animal Control Officer, members of the Police Department, authorized agents of the **TOWN**, and Town Residents, shall be required to complete a New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets, Division of Animal Industry Form "DL 18" entitled "Dog Seizure and Disposition Report" pursuant to §114 of the NYS Agriculture and Markets Law.
- 7. <u>ANIMAL SHELTER:</u> **HI-TOR Animal Care Center Inc.**, through its duly appointed agents and employees, located at 65 Firemen's Memorial Drive, Pomona, New York, shall provide services prescribed herein to the **TOWN OF ORANGETOWN** for seized, lost, strayed

or homeless Domestic Companion Animals to include feral cats pursuant to \$114 of the Agriculture and Markets Law, and shall humanely destroy or dispose of seized and unredeemed animals pursuant to and as provided in the Agriculture and Markets Law, and the Rules and Regulations promulgated thereunder by the Commissioner of Agriculture and Markets, and shall properly care for all domestic companion animals in such shelter, that shall at all times during the term hereof, be under the care and charge of a competent employee.

- 8. PLACEMENT OF ANIMALS AT THE SHELTER: During the term of this Agreement, HI-TOR agrees to use its best efforts to ensure that seized, lost, strayed or homeless domestic companion animals, (which shall include feral cats brought to the Shelter by authorized TOWN personnel or residents), are placed in a run at the Shelter, and that cages appropriate to the size of the animal shall only be utilized as a last resort, and in that event, not for more than TWENTY-FOUR (24) hours.
- 9. <u>POLICIES AND PROCEDURES:</u> During the term of this Agreement, HI-TOR agrees to abide by the policies and procedures set forth in the Dog Officer and Shelter Manual (hereinafter identified as the "Manual") promulgated by the NYS Department of Agriculture & Markets, Division of Animal Industry, last revised March 2014 (a current copy of which is annexed hereto as Exhibit "A"). For example:
  - a. HI-TOR shall maintain, at all times, adequate supplies for the performance of its obligations under this contract, including without limitation, the lawful duties under the "Manual".
  - b. A unique "Dog Control Record #" shall be used for each dog entered on a report; this number shall be assigned by HI-TOR.
  - c. **HI-TOR** shall maintain a copy of this Agreement available for viewing by duly authorized agents of the Department of Agriculture and Markets (DOAM).
  - d. HI-TOR shall file and maintain a complete record of any seizure and subsequent disposition of any dog in the manner proscribed by the Commissioner of the New York
     State Department of Agriculture and Markets.
- 10. <u>BUDGET AND ANTICIPATED EXPENSES:</u> On or before September 1<sup>st</sup> in each year, HI-TOR shall submit, to the Town Supervisor:

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- a. Its budget of its anticipated expenses for the next fiscal year together with a statement of the amount which is proposed to be raised by solicitations and donations to defray such expenses;
- b. A copy of the latest Financial Audit Statement;
- c. A copy of the latest Form 990 filed with the Internal Revenue Service;
- d. A breakdown of cost per animal impounded, including, but not limited to: emergency, medical, veterinary, spay and neuter services; as well as information concerning the number of animals seized, redeemed, adopted, surrendered and/or transferred; the number of animals euthanized, etc.; and
- e. Written proof of its 501(c)(3) status as a not-for-profit corporation.
- 11. <u>IMPOUNDMENT</u>: **HI-TOR** will act as the agent of the **TOWN** to enforce the provisions of §117 of the Agriculture and Markets Law with respect to impoundment periods, impoundment fees, proper licensing and rabies vaccinations. A copy of Agriculture & Markets Law §117 (effective October 6, 2012) is attached hereto as Exhibit "B".
  - a. For Unidentified Dogs: At the end of the legally established impoundment period of FIVE (5) DAYS from the day seized, any unidentified dog, whether or not licensed, unredeemed, aged, diseased or otherwise unadoptable seized, lost, strayed or homeless domestic companion animals (in the judgment of HI-TOR), unless otherwise specified by the Animal Control Officer, shall be disposed of humanely as provided by applicable laws and regulations. At the end of the legally established impoundment period of FIVE (5) DAYS from the day seized, any unidentified dog which is found to be licensed may be redeemed by its owner, provided the owner presents proof that the dog has been licensed, and has been identified (pursuant to NY Agriculture and Markets Law Article 7), and further provided that the owner pays the required impoundment fees as set forth in Agriculture & Markets Law §117(4) payable to the TOWN, plus boarding fees in the amount of TWENTY AND 00/100 (\$20.00) DOLLARS for each twenty-four (24) hour period the Animal has been in the care of HI-TOR payable to the TOWN. All fees must be paid directly to the TOWN Clerk, and a receipt of payment be presented to HI-TOR prior to the release of the animal.
  - b. For Identified Dogs with Notice Given to Owner Personally: If notification is personally given to the owner, such dog shall be held for a period of SEVEN (7) DAYS

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after day of notice, during which period the dog may be redeemed by the owner. The owner may redeem such dog upon payment of the impoundment fees prescribed by Agriculture & Markets Law §117(4), and by producing proof that such dog has been licensed. Upon the expiration of the statutory SEVEN (7) day redemption period, and unless such animal shall have been humanely disposed of, any unredeemed, seized, lost, strayed or homeless domestic companion animal shall be deemed transferred to, and shall become the property, of HI-TOR, which, thereafter, may release such unredeemed animal for adoption, place such animal, or otherwise act with respect to such animal as permitted by law. Following such transfer, the TOWN shall be released and held harmless from any cost, expense or other liability that may be incurred relating to such animal.

- c. For Identified Dogs with Notice Given to Owner by Certified Mail Return Receipt Requested: If notification is made by certified mail, return receipt requested, such dog shall be held for a period of NINE (9) DAYS from the date of the mailing, during which period the dog may be redeemed by the owner. The owner may redeem such dog upon payment of the impoundment fees prescribed by Agriculture & Markets Law §117(4), and by producing proof that such dog has been licensed. Upon the expiration of the statutory NINE (9) day redemption period, and unless such animal shall have been humanely disposed of, any unredeemed, seized, lost, strayed or homeless domestic companion animal shall be deemed transferred to, and shall become the property, of HITOR, which, thereafter, may release such unredeemed animal for adoption, place such animal, or otherwise act with respect to such animal as permitted by law. Following such transfer, the TOWN shall be released and held harmless from any cost, expense or other liability that may be incurred relating to such animal.
- d. <u>Additional holding times</u>: Additional holding times may be required if mandated by a Court of competent jurisdiction pursuant to Article 26 of the Agriculture and Markets Law.
- e. With approval from the Animal Control Officer or Town Clerk, HI-TOR can collect required Impound, Board and Licensing Fees and release an animal to its owner under extenuating circumstances. All such monies collected by HI-TOR on behalf of the

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**TOWN** must be turned over to the **TOWN** Clerk within SEVEN (7) Days of collection with all required documentation.

- f. As agent for the **TOWN**, **HI-TOR** shall not release a dog to any **TOWN** resident without such resident providing acceptable proof of licensing and rabies vaccination.
- g. In addition, **HI-TOR** shall not release a dog found within the **TOWN**, to a resident of New York City or another State unless that party provides proof of license; and if not available, must license the dog before it can be released. Any deviations shall be reported via written letter from **HI-TOR** to the **TOWN** Animal Control Officer (ACO) for enforcement.
- h. In the event an animal has been transferred to HI-TOR and released for adoption due to the expiration of the statutory redemption period, pursuant to section 7(a) hereof, but has not yet been placed, HI-TOR may permit the former owner, if verified, to reclaim the animal upon the payment of both the Impound and Boarding fees required by law and due to the TOWN, plus such amount as may be established by HI-TOR as a charge for each TWENTY-FOUR (24) hour period the animal has been in the care of HI-TOR beyond the SEVEN (7) DAY redemption period. The per diem rate may not, however, exceed the sum of TWENTY (\$20.00) DOLLARS per additional day.
- The per diem fees beyond the statutory redemption period shall be the property of HI-TOR and shall be receipted to the payer by HI-TOR.
- 12. RECEIPTS, CASH DEPOSITS AND DISBURSEMENTS AND CONTROLS: HI-TOR shall install and maintain an adequate automated system of internal controls covering income and expenses, and payments received, to ensure that all of the TOWN's fees are paid to them as set forth herein and in a timely fashion.
- 13. <u>DANGEROUS DOG:</u> There may be times when directed by court order where **HI-TOR** may be required to harbor a dog classified as a "dangerous dog" (as defined in Section 108, paragraph 24(a) of the Agriculture and Markets law). Under such circumstances, the dog shall be harbored in a manner to:
  - a. Prevent escape of the dog;
  - b. Protect the public from unauthorized contact with the dog;

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- Protect the dog from the elements pursuant to Section 353(b) of the Agriculture and Markets Law. Such confinement shall not include lengthy periods of tying or chaining;
- d. The restraint of the dog on a leash by an adult at least TWENTY-ONE (21) years of age whenever the dog is not confined;
- e. The dog is to be exercised only by trained staff personnel and NOT volunteers;
- f. Muzzling the dog whenever it is on public premises in a manner that will prevent it from biting any person or animal but that shall not injure the dog or interfere with his vision or respiration;
- g. Continue to maintain a liability policy in force and effect to indemnify both the **TOWN**, the Shelter and **HI-TOR** for personal injury or death resulting from an attack by such dangerous dog; and
- h. Comply with all orders of a court competent jurisdiction relative to said animal.
- 14. <u>INSURANCE:</u> **HI-TOR** shall be required to procure and maintain at their own expense the following coverage:
  - a. <u>General Liability Insurance:</u> A policy or policies of comprehensive General Liability Insurance with limits of not less than TWO MILLION (\$2,000,000.00) DOLLARS, per occurrence and TWO MILLION (\$2,000,000.00) DOLLARS aggregate.
  - b. <u>Professional Malpractice Insurance</u>: A policy or policies of professional liability insurance with limits of not less than ONE MILLLION (\$1,000,000.00) DOLLARS.
  - c. Each policy of insurance required shall be in the form and content satisfactory to the Town Attorney's Office and shall provide that:
    - The TOWN OF ORANGETOWN is named additional insured on a primary and non-contributing basis;
    - ii. The insurance policies shall not be changed or cancelled until the expiration of THIRTY (30) DAYS after written notice to the **TOWN**; and
    - iii. The insurance policies shall be automatically renewed upon expiration and continued in force unless the TOWN is given SIXTY (60) DAYS written notice to the contrary.
    - iv. Such Insurance Policies shall be placed with a carrier that is rated at least A(-) under AM Best for Liability Insurance.

- v. No work shall be commenced under the contract unless and until proof of insurance required by this contract is submitted to TOWN.
- vi. Upon failure to furnish, deliver and maintain such insurance as described above, this Contract may, at the election of the TOWN, be declared suspended, discontinued or terminated. Failure to procure and maintain any required insurance shall not relieve HI-TOR from any liability under this contract, nor shall the insurance requirements be constructed to conflict with the obligations of HI-TOR concerning indemnification.



The police department would like have an officer attend a certification training course that is geared toward "cellphone data recovery". As you can imagine in these days of advanced technology, the recovery of data from cellphones is becoming an important component to most of our investigations.

We have been in touch with the Clarkstown Police Department who aiready have purchased the equipment needed for conduct cellphone data recovery (Device/software cost: \$ 10,000) Several of their officers' are aiready trained in the use of this technology. The leadership at the Clarkstown Police Department has stated that they are willing to allow their colleagues at Orangetown PD the ability to use this equipment. The host company and Rockland County District Attorney's Office do not have problem with this form of mutual aid agreement. All we need now is the training.

The following is a list of some of the cell phone information that we would be able to recover for investigative purposes:

- A. Text messages and deleted text messages
- B. phone logs
- C. Emails and deleted emails
- D. pictures and deleted pictures
- E. websites visited by the phone
- F. social media apps used on the phone
- G. GPS information
- H. Forensically sound extractions
- I. Ability to extract intelligence from mobile devices on site

Having an officer(s) trained in this technology would be invaluable to our detectives' in moving investigations forward in a more timely and efficient manner. Many times we experience a backlog using the Rockland County Computer Crimes Unit which in turn ties up cases, thus stalling time sensitive investigations.

The Cellebrite certification training is a five (5) day course which wills costs the department approximately \$3,850. The next class is January 23-27, 2017, in Freehold NJ. Freehold NJ is approximately 1.5 hours from Orangetown. The closest class to us after that would be March 6-10, 2017 in Myrtle Beach South Carolina.

The total cost for training courses will \$4,545.00. (Course: \$3,850; Lodging: \$520.00; Meals: \$175.00) The Cellebrite certification training will be paid for using police department Federal Asset Forfeiture Funding. (Confirmed with the Finance Director Bencik that adequate funds exist in the account)

Technology training of this nature will increase our ability to conduct more comprehensive investigations going forward.

One of the most important features of this Town land is its proximity to Lake Tappan and the potential for public access to the Lake. In addition to access, the waterfront park presents an opportunity to provide an inviting path along the Lake, and to preserve areas of natural beauty and scenic views. The Town wishes to hire a Designer to develop a program for the spaces and uses in the park and prepare a schematic design of the park and ancillary facilities. Proposals are due \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2017 at 5:00 p.m.

Overview - Town land at the Rockland Psychiatric Center (RPC) campus, hereinafter the "RPC site" is located within the hamlet of Orangeburg in the central portion of the Town of Orangetown, New York. The Town land consists of 348 acres which is adjacent to the roughly 200 acres owned by New York State, the majority of which are used for the existing Rockland Psychiatric Center Hospital. The Town (and NYS) plans to sell and develop lands adjacent to the waterfront land proposed for public park. Before such new developments occur, the Town Board needs a schematic design prepared for a waterfront park along Lake Tappan. The schematic plan would demarcate the property to be used for the trail, picnic areas and ancillary uses such as parking. The plan would provide potential developers with a clear understanding of the boundaries of the proposed waterfront park and the relationship of the proposed park to parcels available for redevelopment.

#### The Site

**General Description** - The irregularly shaped site is bounded by Old Orangeburg Road and the Town's baseball fields to the south. Lake Tappan, a public reservoir, forms the western boundary. The former Children's Psychiatric Center is to the north. The western boundary is also State owned property. The topography varies from a high point in the southwest corner of the site where the elevation is around 95 feet to the waterfront where it drops to around 50 feet above sea level. The salient natural feature of the property is its proximity to Lake Tappan. The land also includes steep slopes, wooded areas, open fields and wetlands. See Map 1: Site Location.

Acreage – The acreage available for the park is a minimum of 30; the designer is asked to recommend whether additional acreage is desirable.

Wetlands – In 2003, the Town had a wetlands delineation map prepared for the entire 348 acre parcel. Two wetlands were identified that may be included in the park. The wetlands located in the northeast is approximately 10 acres. A second wetlands is located further south, in the area just north of the Town's baseball fields and is approximately 6 acres. In all likelihood, the location of the wetlands will necessitate that they be crossed via a raised boardwalk in at least one place and perhaps more.



#### Scope of Work

After consultation with the Town Board, the Parks Superintendent and other Town staff, and with input from the public, the Designer should prepare a program for the park including:

Lakefront trail

Access roads

Covered pavilion for picnics and gatherings

Picnic areas

Dog park

Other passive recreation

Fishing decks or platforms

Restroom facilities

The Designer should make recommendations for other facilities not included in the above list.

The Designer should prepare three concepts to present to the Town Board, selected staff and the public.

Due to the grade changes along the water's edge, the Designer should include a preliminary grading plan to accompany the concept plans.

Additionally, the Designer should include a concept that includes waterfront property still owned by New York State. This is the parcel that abuts Town property to the north and includes the former Children's Psychiatric Center. It is designated as Parcel 9 on the Map.

One concept will be selected for development into a schematic design. Once developed, the schematic design will be presented to the Town Board, staff and the public. After acceptance by the Town Board, the Town Board anticipates hiring a surveyor to prepare a metes and bounds survey of the park.





The Town bid the annual estimated usage of 5,225 gallons of 40% Sodium Permanganate which is used for odor control in the belt filter press dewatering operation.

Four (4) bids were received with costs ranging from \$15.87/gallon to \$16.143/gallon.

After reviewing the four bids, I recommend awarding the bid to ESC Environmental who submitted the low bid of \$15.87/gallon.

This is \$0.31 lower than we had been paying (\$16.18/gallon) and will save \$1,619.75 annually, providing that the usage stays the same.
