3. WHEREAS, by previous duly adopted the 2nd day of May 2017, the Town Board resolved to proceed with its consideration of the proposed action, consisting of a local law establishing a new Conditional Use by the Planning Board, permitting Attached Veteran Housing in the R-15 zoning district zoning district; and

WHEREAS, by the same resolution, the Town Board declared its intent to serve as lead agency for the environmental review thereof under the N.Y.S. Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), and directed circulation of the proposed text amendment for review, comment and SEQRA to various involved and/or interested agencies, including, but not limited to, the Rockland County Department of Planning, pursuant to General Municipal Law § 239 I & m; and

WHEREAS, by letter with attachments, dated May 12, 2017, all materials relevant to the review of the proposed action were circulated to the various interested and involved agencies, and to the Rockland County Planning Department and the Village Planning Board, for review, comment and lead agency status; and

WHEREAS, no agency has objected to the Town Board acting as lead agency for the environmental review of the action; and

WHEREAS, for the purpose of amending the Town Code, as proposed, the Town Board is the only involved agency under SEQRA, and, therefore, is the only appropriate entity to act as lead agency,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby assumes lead agency status for purposes of environmental review of the action as set forth above under SEQRA; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, (1) that the proposed action is an unlisted action under SEQRA; and, (2) that, having taken a hard look at all of the environmental issues associated with the said action, and the areas affected, including all of the possible impacts identified on the Short EAF prepared and submitted in connection with the said action, the Town Board issues a

Determination of Non-significance with respect to the referenced action, and authorizes the Town Supervisor, or his designated agent, to take such other and further steps as may be necessary to discharge the Town Board's responsibilities as Lead Agency in accordance with the applicable provisions of law.

In reaching the within determination, the Town Board has considered, among other things, the specific lot and bulk controls which limit the parcels within the district to which the conditional use applies, including the number of units on any given parcel (5 units per acre on a minimum 5-acre parcel), and the further condition that such housing shall be on located on or along or in immediate proximity to a State or County road readily accessible to public transportation services, which mitigate any potential adverse impact.

The Board has further considered the appropriateness, and site conditions, of the existing Homes for Heroes location, on Western Highway, which already has been partially developed with such use, including the green infrastructure drainage project proposed by the Town for an immediately adjacent parcel owned by the Town, and the various studies commissioned by the Town and by the U.S. government relating to the use of the entirety of such parcel.

4. WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Orangetown (the "Town Board") is the duly elected legislative body of the Town, authorized to adopt zoning text amendments to the Town's Zoning Law; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has before it for consideration a proposed local law that, if adopted, would amend Chapter 43 of the Town Code (the Town Zoning Law), adding "Attached Veteran Housing", as defined, and as otherwise regulated by referenced lot and bulk regulations, as a new conditional use in the R-15 zoning district; and

WHEREAS, the proposed conditional use would allow the continued improvement of those lands located on Western Highway, in the hamlet of Tappan, in the manner in which such lands

already have been partially developed, albeit as federally owned lands, and, thus, not subject to the Town's zoning; and

WHEREAS, by resolution duly adopted of even date herewith, but prior to the adoption of this resolution, the Town Board, acting in its capacity as Lead Agency for environmental review, concluded that there will be no significant adverse environmental impacts or effects caused or occasioned by the proposed changes to the Town's Zoning Law; and

WHEREAS, following due and proper notice, on May 23, 2017, the Town Board held a public hearing on the proposed local law, at which a number of persons spoke concerning the proposed law; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board, and each of its members, are personally familiar with the locations affected by the proposed zoning text amendment;

NOW, BASED ON ALL OF THE INFORMATION BEFORE THE BOARD, AND THE FINDINGS HEREINAFTER MADE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby adopts the proposed Local Law, amending Chapter 43, § 3.11 of the Town Code, which establishes and incorporates the various Tables of General Use Regulations, at 43 Attachment 3, Column 4, Use 2, Conditional Uses by Planning Board, with respect to the R-15 zoning district, to add "attached veteran housing"; amending Chapter 43 (Zoning) of the Town Code, Note 15 of the Notes to the Notes to the Use and Bulk Tables, shall be amended to add "attached veteran housing"; amending Chapter 43, § 3.12 of the Town Code, which establishes and incorporates the various Tables of General Bulk Regulations, shall be amended at 43 Attachment 13 with respect to the R-15 zoning district, to add "Attached veteran housing" to Use Group N, Column 3; amending Chapter 43 ("Zoning"), Article 10, § 11.2 (Definitions) to add a definition of "Attached veteran housing"; and amending Chapter 43 ("Zoning"), Article VIII, to add a new § 8.17 entitled "Attached Veteran Housing" as a Conditional Use of the Planning Board in the R-15 zoning district, as set forth in the proposed law, annexed hereto, and made a part hereof.

In adopting the within local law, the Town Board, pursuant to General Municipal Law § 239, has solicited, received and considered the comments and conditions of the Rockland County Department of Planning, set forth in 2 separate responsive letters, each dated March 15, 2017, and adopts or overrides such comments and conditions as follows:

The Rockland County Planning Department's Comments and Conditions

1) Letter Comments:

TO BE ADDED

PROPOSED LOCAL LAW, AMENDING CHAPTER 43 OF THE ZONING LAW OF THE TOWN OF ORANGETOWN PERMITTING VETERAN HOUSING AS A CONDITIONAL USE IN THE R-15 ZONING DISTRICT

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Orangetown as follows:

- Section 1. Chapter 43, § 3.11 of the Town Code, which establishes and incorporates the various Tables of General Use Regulations shall be amended at 43 Attachment 3, Column 4, Use 2, Conditional Uses by Planning Board, with respect to the R-15 zoning district, to add "attached veteran housing". As amended, 43 Attachment 3, Column 4, Use 2, shall read:
 - 2. Attached veteran housing, and single or attached adult housing residential uses as provided in Note 15 of the Notes to the Use and Bulk Tables. Adult housing (but not Attached veteran housing) shall be limited to families with 1 adult over age 50 and no child under 18 years.
- Section 2. Chapter 43 (Zoning) of the Town Code, Note 15 of the Notes to the Notes to the Use and Bulk Tables, shall be amended to add "attached veteran housing" where the term "attached adult housing residences", such that such note, in relevant part, shall read as follows:
 - ". . . the Planning Board may also permit a cluster development of not more than four (4) attached veteran housing or adult housing residences, provided"
- Section 3. Chapter 43, § 3.12 of the Town Code, which establishes and incorporates the various Tables of General Bulk Regulations, shall be amended at 43 Attachment 13 with respect to the R-15 zoning district, to add "Attached veteran housing" to Use Group N, Column 3. As amended, Column 3, Use Group N, shall read:

Attached veteran housing and single-family attached residences for adults in buildings not more than 2 stories high**

A further note shall be added, by asterisk ***, relating to Additional Note 18, which shall read as follows:

The limitations of Note 18 shall not apply to Attached Veteran Housing to the extent same impose limits or requirements relating to bedroom count or prior construction within 500 feet.

Section 4. Amend the Town Code of the Town of Orangetown, Chapter 43 ("Zoning"), Article 10, § 11.2 (Definitions) to add a definition of "Attached veteran housing", which shall read as follows

ATTACHED VETERAN HOUSING — attached residential housing units for honorably discharged veterans of the United States armed services who meet the federal criteria as homeless, owned and/or operated by a private not-for-profit corporation, organized as such under the laws of the State of New York, and having status as an IRS 501[c]3 entity.

Section 5: Amend the Town Code of the Town of Orangetown, Chapter 43 ("Zoning"), Article VIII, to add a new § 8.17 entitled "Attached Veteran Housing" as a Conditional Use of the Planning Board in the R-15 zoning district, which section shall read as follows:

§ 8.17. Attached Veteran Housing.

- A. Attached Veteran Housing, as defined at § 11.2 hereof, shall be permitted as a conditional use in the R-15 zoning district.
- B. Such housing shall be subject to the Table of General Bulk Regulations, 43 Attachment 13, Use Group N.
- C. Such housing shall be on located on or along or in immediate proximity to a State or County road readily accessible to public transportation services.

Section 6: This local law shall take effect immediately on filing with the Secretary of State.

7. WHEREAS, on April 4, 2017 the Town Board approved an Access Agreement for Russo Development to conduct environmental assessment of Tax Lot 73.15-1-17 pursuant to Russo's offer to purchase the land for data center development, and

WHEREAS, the Town is considering relocating public facilities from Tax Lot 73.15-1-17 to a portion of Tax Lot 72.12-1-3.1 on the RPC campus and needs Russo Development to provide certification of the location of wetlands and hence the extent of building area at this site, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board authorizes the amendment of Schedule "A" of the Access Agreement to include 200 Old Orangeburg Road, Tax Lot 72.12-1-3.1.

MUNICIPAL RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF HUDSON RIVER SLOOP CLEARWATER'S SAIL TO WASHINGTON DC TO MAINTAIN CLEAN WATER AND OTHER ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTIONS

8. WHEREAS in 1970 Pete Seeger and the Hudson River Sloop Clearwater helped turn the tide in favor of enacting the 1972 Clean Water Act by sailing the Clearwater to Washington, DC and

organizing an historic Capitol Hill forum on the need for federal clean water protections, where Seeger said,

"The problems of the American Rivers can't be solved by people . . . who live on them. Only the Federal Government has the power to enact and enforce the laws that are needed;" and

WHEREAS the Hudson River and many American waterways are much cleaner and safer as a result of the implementation of the Clean Water Act, as well as other state and national environment protection legislation and regulations; and

WHEREAS issues of serious water pollution still plague communities from Flint, Michigan to the City of Newburgh or the Village of Hoosic Falls in New York; and

WHEREAS a clean, safe and healthy environment is foundational for a strong economy; and

WHEREAS existing federal clean water protections, have recently been rolled back or are coming under threat from many quarters, including:

- Using the Congressional Review Act to undo the Stream Protection Rule, which previously protected waterways from surface coal mining pollution;
- Using the EPA rulemaking process to "repeal and replace" the Waters of the United States Rule, which extended Clean Water Act protections to 60% of U.S. streams and 20 million acres of wetlands, and these waters and wetlands will soon lose those protections if the Rule is undone;
- Proposed 31% cuts to EPA funding, including, among other things: a 45% cut in Categorical Grants to states for water protection programs; elimination of the \$427 million funding of the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative and other regional programs; a total estimated cut of \$1 billion in Office of Water programs; and

WHEREAS proposed cuts to Superfund would undermine Superfund cleanup in 85 sites across New York State; and

WHEREAS federal water protections and robust EPA regulation and enforcement are vital to the environmental health of New York's waterways and to the safety of its drinking water; and

WHEREAS climate change is also a water quality issue and already impacts New York's waterways and drinking waters through more frequent and severe droughts and storms; and

WHEREAS many water quality issues, such as phosphorus loading of our lakes and streams, directly impact aquatic life and recreation, and will require increases in Federal funding for stormwater infrastructure; and

WHEREAS drinking water contaminants which jeopardize public health and safety are just being uncovered in many existing water systems, flat-funding Federal grants will not allow States and municipalities to implement drinking and waste water infrastructure projects needed for their prevention or remediation; and

WHEREAS these issues and threats affect not only all New Yorkers, but all Americans; and

WHEREAS the Sloop Clearwater will carry to Washington and deliver to federal officials a "cargo of concern" documenting the broad-based concerns of citizens, public interest groups, and municipal and state officials throughout New York about growing threats to our water and to federal clean water protections, and the need for sound, science-based water policy;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Orangetown hereby registers its deep concern over current rollbacks and threats to federal clean water protections as described above, affirms the need for sound, science-based water policy and for adequate regulation, enforcement and funding as pressure on water quality and safety continue to mount. We also wish to express our support for the effort Clearwater is leading to carry our concerns and concerns of many New Yorkers for clean water and other environmental protections directly to Washington.

A new definition will be added, and the existing general bulk regulations for Use Group "N" will be used for the new use. As part of the conditional use, the housing must be located on or along, or in immediate proximity, to a State or County road.

Reason for Referral:

State and County roads, county streams, Palisades Interstate Parkway, Village of Piermont, Town of Clarkstown

The County of Rockland Department of Planning has reviewed the above item. Acting under the terms of the above GML powers and those vested by the County of Rockland Charter, I, the Commissioner of Planning, hereby:

*Recommend the following modifications

- 1 A review shall be completed by the New York State Department of Transportation, and any concerns addressed.
- 2 A review shall be completed by the Rockland County Department of Highways, and any concerns addressed.
- 3 It must be clarified if the Palisades Interstate Parkway qualifies for a "State road."
- 4 It must be clarified if there are minimum/maximum standards for the housing units, such as square footage per unit.

5 The Town of Clarkstown and the Village of Piermont are two of the reasons this proposal was referred to this department for review. The review undertaken by the Rockland County Planning Department is pursuant to, and follows the mandates of Article 12-B of the New York General Municipal Law. Under Article 12-B the County of Rockland does not render opinions, nor does it make determinations, whether the item reviewed implicates the Religious Land Use and Institutionalized Persons Act. The Rockland County Planning Department defers to the municipality forwarding the item reviewed to render such opinions and make such determinations if appropriate under the circumstances.

In this respect, municipalities are advised that under the Religious Land Use and Institutionalized Persons Act, the preemptive force of any provision of the Act may be avoided (1) by changing a policy or practice that may result in a substantial burden on religious exercise, (2) by retaining a policy or practice and exempting the substantially burdened religious exercise, (3) by providing exemptions from a policy or practice for applications that substantially burden religious exercise, or (4) by any other means that eliminates the substantial burden.

Proponents of projects are advised to apply for variances, special permits or exceptions, hardship approval or other relief.

Pursuant to New York State General Municipal Law §239-m(6), the referring body shall file a report of final action it has taken with the Rockland County Department of Planning within thirty (30) days after final action. A referring body which acts contrary to a recommendation of modification or disapproval or a proposed action shall set forth the reasons for the contrary action in such report.

SHOWMOBILE RESERVATION PROCEDURES Town of Orangetown, Orangeburg NY

The Town of Orangetown through the Parks & Recreation Department supports a variety of non-profit organization community events. Priority scheduling is given to Orangetown Parks & Recreation events and then Town of Orangetown Department requests.

Due to the Orangetown Summer Concert Series the Orangetown Showmobile will not be available beginning July 1st to August 20th this year.

Use of the Showmobile is NOT confirmed until:

- 1. Your completed application is received by the Orangetown Office of Recreation & Parks.
- 2. A certificate of insurance listing the Town of Orangetown as additionally insured is provided.
- 3. Your organization has been informed that the application is complete.
- 4. Your application is approved by resolution by the Orangetown Town Council and the Office of Recreation and Parks has notified you of such.

There are two fees associated with the rental of the Showmobile:

A rental fee of \$400.00 (applicable to all groups)

Staffing overtime (waived by the Town Board for non-profits)

The organization will receive an emailed invoice after their event is complete. Payment is expected no later than 14 days after receipt of such invoice.

Space and Placement

The total area required for the showmobile placement is 50 feet in length, 15 feet in width and 25 feet in height.

The placement of the Showmobile is at the discretion of the Orangetown Parks & Recreation staff. Although all efforts will be made to meet requests, this equiment does not go off road, over curbing or over rough terrain.

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 36 of the 2013 bid specifications, and section 33 of the 2013 executed Contract, the Town Board, subject to agreement by the Contract Vendor, is authorized to extend the 2013 Contract, for an additional year or years (to a maximum of 3), under the same terms and conditions as the 2013 Contract; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Paragraph 36 of the 2013 Contract, by letter dated May 7, 2015, Chestnut Ridge Transportation once again has agreed to extend the Contract for the 2015 camp season (the 3rd and final year under the 2013 Bid), upon the same terms and conditions, including at the same cost to the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent believes that it is in the Town's best financial interest to extend the 2013 bus transportation contract, for the 2015 camp season,
